THE BISHOP'S LENTEN SEASON PASTORAL

Ash Wednesday Services Held Today at Episcopal and Catholic Churches

Today—Ash Wednesday—is the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday services were held both at the Catholic and Episcopal churches in this city. At the Episcopal church a Lenten pastoral by Bishop Scadding, of the diocese of Oregon, was read, as follows:

"Oregon is not an irreligious country; but the religious life is lacking in quality. As a watchman set upon the wall it is my duty to sound the note of warning against religious apathy, indifference, the spirit of impiety evidenced in lack of attendance upon the part of many at public worship, the dull spiritual inertia of many, making them mere loafers around the barracks who in baptism are enlisted to fight manfully under Christ's banner, and a practical materialism which disbelieves the teachings of Christ. easy, and in keeping with the spirit of the age, to say these things are mere figments of the imagination, that being evil they do not exist, and to cry 'peace, peace,' but the word of the Lord to Ezekiel rings in my ears: 'I have made thee a watchman; therefore hear the word at my mouth, and give them warning from me.' Oregon is developing rapidly on commercial and material lines; its resources, so largely undeveloped at present, are enormous, and are attracting thousands of settlers in whom the struggle for existence demands an attention to material, earthly things of time and sense which tends to dull the realization of eternal realities. In all its forms sin means a misconception of the proportion of things. It is this which condemns so severely the easy-going worldliness which is clear of grosser falls, yet never fastens on life's secrets. It is the sin of misconception, of misdirection, of wrong perspective. Round and above us the great work of God moves, presses forward and strains to its fulfillment. Eternal issues are at stake; voices call us to the work; angels reach out helping hands; the Holy Spirit urges, beseeches, invites. And what are we about? What fleeting interests occupy our attention? On what contemptible littleness is our desire set? What folly it all is! Lost and busy in the thick of occupations that can have no issue, no fruit hereafter, we are in danger of becoming blind to the glory of our eternal destiny in Christ Jesus. Against us, as inevitably as against him who of old saw nothing to do here but to build barns and lay up earthly treasures, it is God himself who utters the sentence: 'Thou fool! whole world and lose his own soul! To rescue the soul from this loss, to release it, to recover it, to pluck it out of the snare, to open a passage by which it may escape into air and light and freedom, to save ourselves from making a fatal miscalculation—that is our Lenten work. That is worth a little pains, a little discipline. It can be done by the power and grace of God. We have no means of knowing what Jesus would do were He here in Oregon and in this age. We know very well what He has told us to do if we have ears to hear. Jesus said: 'If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow me.' God grant that we may all cherish during this Lenten season each opportunity offered in the frequent services of the church, to get the right perspective of life, to see eternal things, to hear the voice of God and not only the din of the world, and to renew and strengthen our Christian character.

SEEKS TO ENJOIN WARREN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY AGAIN

J. R. Sellers Wants to Abolish the Quarry and Mixing Plant Nuisance

Another suit was begun in the circuit court today by J. R. Sellers to restrain the Warren Construction Company from operating and maintaining its rock quarry and crusher and mixing plant on Lincoln street, on the west slope of Skinner's butte. It will be remembered that Sellers began a similar suit last fall, but the company agreed to permanently discontinue the plant, according to Sellers' allegations in the complaint, on December 1 of last year in consideration of the dismissal of the suit. Sellers now alleges that the company is preparing to operate the quarry and mixing plant again and that thereby his property in that part of the city will be irreparably damaged unless a restraining order is granted.

As a matter of fact, negotiations are now being made between the company and the city to remove the mixing plant to a location on the river bank, north of the butte, so that the dust nuisance will not annoy any one. It is also intended to operate the quarry and rock crushers without blasting.
