ASHLAND CITY DADS GIVE EUGENE GREAT PRAISE

Mayor and Two Councilmen Here to Look at Pavement and Public Improvements

Mayor R. M. Snell and Councilman W. P. Loomis and F. W. Moore, of Ashland, arrived in Eugene this morning for the purpose of examining the pavement and other public improvements.

Mayor Matlock and other members of the city council took the visitors over the city and so favorably were they impressed with the amount of pavement and other improvements of a public nature, that they were heard to remark that they wished that the same go-ahead spirit prevailed in their home city as it does here.

Mayor Snell said to a Guard reporter: "I was very much surprised at the great amount of street pavement in Eugene, also the cleanliness of the city, the beautiful homes, the splendid new business blocks and the progressiveness that seems to pervade the atmosphere here. We knew that Eugene was a progressive city, but were unprepared to see so many public improvements that a city of twice the population might well be proud of."

From here the visitors go to Portland to examine the several different kinds of pavement on the streets there with a view of selecting suitable material with which to pave Ashland's business streets this year.

JAP COOKS WILL FORM CLUB—MAY BE UNION

Eleven Japanese cooks of the University of Oregon student club houses will form a fraternity during the next month, and will have a house on East Thirteenth street. The members will be almost entirely Japanese, who are working at the societies and fraternities of the University. The purpose is to better conditions and to make their lives more pleasant. Some of the students think it probable that the club will develop into a union, and that at some future date the club organizations will be asked to pay a few cents an hour or day more.

OBITUARY

George C. Snyder was born December 25, 1841, in Hamburg, Mich., and died February 16, 1909, in Co. burg, Or., of paralysis. When yet a small boy he moved with his parents to Minnesota. In early manhood he enlisted in the civil war, serving his country four years. When mustered out he stood next in rank to captain. He at one time saved our flag from being captured by the enemy, receiving the honor of carrying the flag through the streets of Washington, D. C. Mr. Snyder married Miss Mary Stearn in 1866, and to them were born 12 children. Mrs. Snyder died nearly three years ago. The following children survive them: Mrs. Meda Catching, Springfield, Or.; Cramer Snyder, Co. burg, Or.; Mrs. Araminta Heller, Eugene; Mrs. Hattie Williams, Co. burg, Or.; James Snyder, Marcola, Or.; Mrs. Grace Hanson, Portland, Or.; Pearl Snyder, Portland, Or., and Cecil Snyder, at home. Mr. Snyder moved with his family to Nebraska in 1877, coming to Oregon in 1888 and living at Co. burg until death. Mr. Snyder married again to Mrs. Jennie Cook, who survives him. During his sickness of three weeks the children were constantly at his bedside to comfort and care for him.
