EVANGELISTIC SERVICES FILL METHODIST CHURCH

Evangelist Kennedy Speaks on "A Dewdrop." Tonight, "A Shut Door."

Last night the Methodist church was well filled to hear another pointed, pungent discourse from Evangelist Kennedy. He spoke on "A Dewdrop." Text, Ps. 119:3. He said there were several things to be noticed about a dew drop and then asked his hearers if they were as Christians as the dew drop in these particulars: (1) That a dew drop was beautiful; are you as a Christian beautiful? "Some people never seem to be happy unless they have something to grumble about," said the evangelist. "It depends a great deal upon the kind of spectacles you wear as to how things look; some people are always wearing blue spectacles and always finding fault with everything because they look blue. Don't find fault with God's world because your own little world is upset. Some people are like a crust stand. No matter how you turn them round you get something either hot or sour. When you get your photo taken you don't take it unless it's a good one. In fact you don't take it unless it's just a little better looking than ever you were and then you want everybody to look at it. Why? Because it does you justice. Say, friends, you are supposed to be a photograph of Christ and of Christianity and if you are not living a happy, cheerful life you are not revealing true Christianity to this world at all. (2) A dew drop is pure; are you pure? In life? In strength? In heart? The pure in heart see God (in every thing). Jesus was pure in heart. He saw God everywhere, in the trees, in the flowers, in the clouds. If you are pure you will see God even in the very trials of life. (3) A dew drop is a mirror. It reflects the heavens. Do you do that? Remember, Christian, that the godly man is the ungodly man's bible. This sinful world is reading you and me, a mirror is worse than no good at all. So are you. (4) A dew drop is refreshing. The grass is green all day because it has been there; are you refreshing? Are you useful? Are you helpful? Are you the salt of the earth? Salt is good for three things: (1) As a savor. Forget to put it in your food and things don't taste right. Have you the right kind of savor in the circle you move in? (2) Salt is good to make things smart. Do you make things smart; are you a terror to evil doers? (3) Salt keeps things from spoiling; are you keep anybody from spoiling? "Ye are the light of the world." Men stumble when they have no light. You are intended to keep others from walking in the dark. (5) A dew drop comes in the night. It asks not for the applause of the world or the praise of men. It is humble so should the Christian be. (6) A dew drop comes from above; are you born from above? Are you born again? You say you are a church member; that may be, and yet you may not be born again. Have you ever looked for the Savior and lived? Are you converted? Have you grace in your heart? Have you oil in your lamp? Is Jesus really and truly dew drop comes from above; are you Him now? May God help you do it."

The evangelist is a thorough bible student and all his speaking is saturated with scripture. All attending the 2:30 p. m. services will be delighted and profited. Come tomorrow and be convinced. Subject tonight: "A Shut Door." Tomorrow night, "A Woman's Last Word." Every man will be curious to know how it happened. The chorus is doing fine work and adding much to the services.

PLANS FOR Y. M. C. A. BUILDING FINALLY ADOPTED

Three-Story Brick Structure to Be Put Up—Work Will Soon Begin

At a meeting of the Y. M. C. A. board of directors last night the plans submitted for the building by Architect Y. D. Hensill were finally adopted and the building committee authorized to go to work at once with the erection of the structure. The old residence on the lot has been sold to John Christian, who will move it off by the middle of the month. The new building will be three stories high and will have a frontage on Willamette street of 72 feet, being 124 feet deep. The front will be faced with round edged red pressed brick. It will be finished in Colonial style. The building will be modern in every way and the interior will be very conveniently arranged with all the conveniences and appointments usually found in a first class Y. M. C. A. home.

ATTORNEY FENTON ARGUES FOR RAILROAD

Portland, March 2.—Speaking for the Oregon & California railroad company, W. D. Fenton did not conclude his argument in support of the railroad company's demurrer to the government's bill of complaint in the land grant suit until late yesterday afternoon. Mr. Fenton's peroration was an especially eloquent and forceful presentation of the reasons why the railroad company would have United States Judge Wolverton set aside the complaint of the government in its suit to annul the grant of 40 years ago, by which about 3,000,000 acres of land were transferred to the Oregon Central railroad company and afterwards acquired by the Harriman interests, which appear as the interested defendants in the pending suit.

In concluding the argument Mr. Fenton scored heavily the 5000 intervenors, who appear as defendants in the big legal battle, and characterized them as timber speculators, who were hiding behind the skirts of the government in their quest of valuable land under the terms of a grant, which counsel said was dead and in defiance of all that was fair and just.
