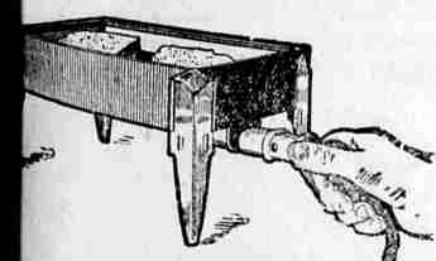

HORACE MCKINLEY

The Portland Journal editorially roasts Horace McKinley, the aristocratic prisoner in the Multnomah county jail, in the following manner: "If Horace C. McKinley were sent to the rockpile to serve the remainder of his term in jail, the ends of both justice and decency would be well served. He is infinitely more despicable and more worthy of punishment than ninety-nine out of one hundred of the offenders who are placed behind the bars of the county jail. The sentence imposed upon him was utterly inadequate to his crimes, and ever since his incarceration he has been treated as a pampered pet. If Sheriff Stevens does not devise some punishment for McKinley's recent assault upon a newspaper reporter he is lacking in his duty. The public does not take kindly to the idea of an 'aristocracy' among jailbirds, still less to the news that such a scoundrel as McKinley is one of the 'aristocrats'."

FILIPINO METHODISTS

FORM NEW CHURCH

Manila, March 4.—Nicholas Seamora, a leading Filipino preacher, has withdrawn from the Methodist Episcopal church and, with 1,000 followers, organized the Evangelical Methodist church of the Philippines. It is planned to elect Rev. Mr. Seamora bishop of the new organization. Two native ministers and a dozen local preachers in the Methodist Episcopal church have joined the movement.

It is possible that a similar movement will be started in the Presbyterian church. There appear to be no doctrinal differences between Mr. Seamora and his followers and the Methodist Episcopal faith, and apparently they were actuated only by the desire for a completely independent organization.
