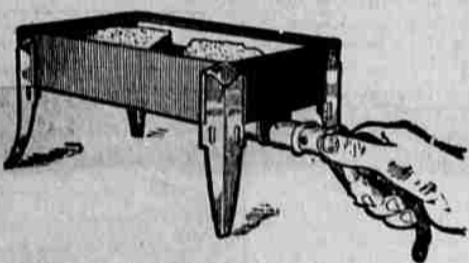

for a Quarter of a Century

New York, March 6.—Twenty-five teams have been selected for the international six-day go-as-you-please race, which is to start in Madison Square Garden at midnight on Sunday night. The list includes representatives of twelve different nationalities, and many of the contestants have won international honors. The race, which will be the first big event of the kind held in New York in a quarter of a century, is exciting an unusual amount of interest, and promises to be one of the leading sporting events of the winter season.

Boston, Mass., March 6.—Everything is in readiness for the opening of the Boston automobile show in Mechanics' building tonight, following months spent in perfecting plans and making ready for what is pronounced to be the largest and most representative display of motor cars and accessories ever brought together under one roof. The exhibition will continue through the coming week.

The show embraces the cream of the exhibits seen at the automobile shows held earlier in the season in New York and Chicago. In addition there are a number of cars that are entirely new and have not heretofore been exhibited. The display as a whole is declared to be the most comprehensive and elaborate exhibit of its kind ever attempted in America, representing as it does the combined efforts of millions of capital with the best engineering talent in the world.
