### SURVEYORS WELL PLEASED WITH ROUTE TO FLORENCE

#### Say Route by Way of Smithfield and Lake Creek Is Practicable

Last Friday E. L. Haines and W. E. Gamble, railway engineers, arrived at Florence from Eugene. They came in by way of Smithfield and Triangle Lake then down Lake Creek and the Siuslaw to Florence, says the West.

They are making a preliminary survey of three proposed routes for the electric road from Eugene. They spent Friday afternoon and part of Saturday here looking over the situation and returned to Mapleton Saturday evening.

They left Mapleton for Eugene the first of the week, going out over the stake road. Later they will examine the route by way of Corvallis to see what obstacles would be encountered there.

In conversation here they informed us that the route by way of Smithfield and Lake Creek is practicable and it would not be difficult to construct a road through that country. The highest ridge it would cross is about 1000 feet above sea level.

Mr. Gamble stated that the pass where they crossed the Coast Mountains is the best he knows of in that range.

They made many inquiries about the harbor proposition and stated that the question of building the road depends in a great measure upon the harbor improvements, as without an outlet to the ocean for vessels the local business would not pay to build the road.

THE LATE DONALD G. MITCHELL (IK MARVEL).

Donald G. Mitchell, known all over the world as Ik Marvel, author of "Reveries of a Bachelor" and "Dream Life," who died recently at his home in Connecticut, was born in Norwich, Conn., in April, 1822. His father was a clergyman and took personal charge of the early education of the son, implanting in his mind many of the beautifully poetic sentiments that made Mr. Mitchell's work so dear to the hearts of thousands of readers in after life. In his youth Mr. Mitchell was very delicate and after his graduation went abroad in search of health. His first work to attract general attention was "Reveries of a Bachelor," which he produced in 1850.
