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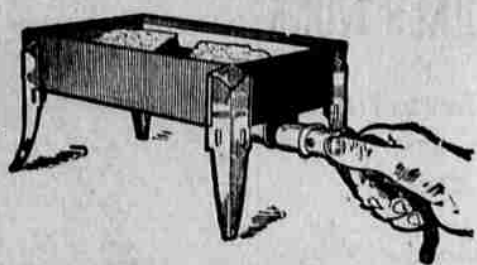

BENSON BESIEGED TO GRANT PARDONS

Salem, Or., March 17.—On June 16, 1907, Silas Tate was received at the penitentiary to serve a term of seven years upon conviction of burglary in Union county. Shortly afterward Governor Chamberlain was petitioned to pardon him, but sufficient reasons were not advanced to warrant the governor to exercise executive clemency, but now the application is to be renewed with Governor Benson, and upon new grounds—that Tate is innocent of the crime. Governor Benson will investigate.

Since his succession to the chief executive's throne, Governor Benson has been besieged with a deluge of applications for pardons, the most of which are renewals presented by the petitioners, no doubt, with renewed hopes of success with the change of administration. There have been no less than 50 applications presented since Governor Benson was sworn in.

ONLY SIX SOLONS PAY OWN FARES

Salem, Or., March 17.—Members of the legislature failed to avail themselves of the opportunity to serve in the official session without expense to the state; at least only six of them did so—Senators Abraham, Kay, Kellaker, F. J. Miller, Parrish and Speaker McArthur. The expenses of the special session are about \$7,500. The only new appropriation, aside from this, is \$300 for extinguishers in the asylum. The \$360,000 appropriation for improvements in state institutions is not considered new.

Mileage in the Senate amounts to \$1155.58, in the house, \$2280.95. Salaries in the Senate, \$194; in the House, \$254.
