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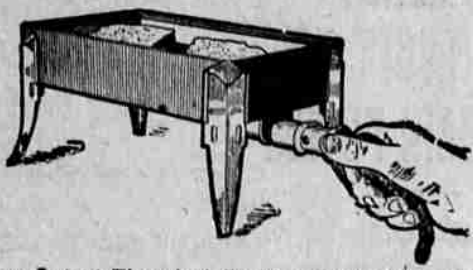

NEVADA ROAD?

Harriman Said to Plan Extension of Reno-Alto Line as Part of Oregon Eastern.

Portland railroad men are much concerned today over a report from San Francisco to the effect that E. H. Harriman has purchased the Nevada, California & Oregon railway, a narrow gauge line which runs north from Reno, Nev., to Alturas, and will extend it by way of Lakeview to some point near the Klamath reservation, there to connect it with the proposed Southern Pacific line from the main line in Lane county to Klamath Falls. Much credence is given the report.

From San Francisco comes the story that the Southern Pacific, through Mr. Harriman, has purchased the narrow gauge line, will broaden gauge it and extend it through to Portland. T. E. Dunaway, vice president and general manager of the railroad, has denied the rumor, but at the same time he admitted that the road was for sale, and that such a deal had been proposed by the Harriman interests.

To Portland railroad officials the report looks good for the reason that it has long been known that Mr. Harriman was trying to secure a direct line from Portland to the East by way of Salt Lake City and Ogden. This would be easily accomplished by a connection being made between the proposed S. P. line and the narrow gauge road, which connects the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific at Reno for the East. Then, too, such a line as is reported to be projected would open up the immense livestock, lumbering and agricultural district of southeastern Oregon.—Salem Journal.

RECOMMEND BEAN

FOR FEDERAL JUDGE

Lawyers of Portland Sign Petition Urging Appointment to Bench.

Lawyers of Portland are freely signing a recommendation for the appointment of Justice R. L. Dean, of the Oregon supreme court, to the new federal judgeship which C. W. Fulton wants, says the Oregon Journal. This morning Wallace McCamant and Robert E. Wilbur circulated the recommendation among the attorneys and secured nearly 100 signatures in a few hours. This petition will be forwarded to Washington directed to President Taft.

This is another phase of the development of opposition against the appointment of Fulton as federal judge. Francis J. Heney is now attacking Fulton at Washington through Tracy C. Becker, and there have been many protests filed with President Taft already against the ex-United States senator.

When Jay Bowerman prepared a resolution unqualifiedly endorsing Fulton for judge and had C. W. Parish introduce it in the state senate, Milt A. Miller, Democrat, introduced a resolution endorsing Bean. The resolutions committee of the senate never reported on the resolutions, as Bowerman discovered that the Fulton endorsement would be fought on the floor and defeated. A lobbyist is said to have received a telegram from Fulton asking that as many resolutions as possible be sent to Washington, at the expense of Fulton himself. Later came word from Washington that many members of the state senate had telegraphed endorsements, and Fulton explained that the only reason the senate did not endorse him as a body was because no new business was to be considered at the special session.

The Bean resolution was introduced by Miller for the purpose of blocking the Fulton resolution, and was partly instrumental in the resolutions committee not reporting the Fulton endorsement.
