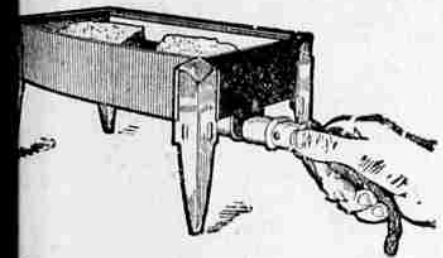

HARRIMAN AND HILL ARE AGREED

**Important Conference of Rail-
road Magnates Comes
to a Close**

San Francisco, March 28.—A most
important conference between Harri-
man and Louis Hill took place yester-
day at Burlingame, at the close of
which it was announced that a com-
plete agreement had been reached.
The railway magnates spent the
entire afternoon together, and to-
night both departed. Harriman
went south, while Hill will return
north.

Hill said after the meeting that
there was no hostility between the
two big systems, but that they were
working in complete harmony.

He also said all misunderstandings
concerning the Portland situation had
been settled satisfactorily. All dif-
ficulties growing out of the construc-
tion of the North Bank road had been
adjusted and an understanding had
been reached as to the building of
certain lines in connection with the
Portland terminal. Hill said:

"All this talk of conflict between
the Hill and Harriman systems is
rubbish. For more than nine years
the two systems have been work-
ing in harmony, though business ri-
vals. During the conference just
concluded the get-together spirit has
prevailed, and there have been no se-
rious differences. Neither side has
anything to gain by destructive com-
petition."

The impression prevails among
men who have come in touch with
both magnates that an alliance has
been concluded which is only one
step removed from a merger between
the two systems.

COLLEGE MAN HAS 640 EXTRA CHANCES

**President Riley, of McMinnville,
Says Church Colleges
Are Best Educators**

"A man has 640 chances to become
famous if he is a college trained man
to one who has had no education,
and three hundred times the proba-
bility of becoming a millionaire,"
said President Riley, of McMinnville
College, in an address at the Baptist
church Sunday night. He compared
value of education and continued:
"A man with only a common school
education, one with merely a high
school education, receives on the av-
erage 100 per cent more, and one
with a college education always
makes from 200 to 300 per cent
more, if not a still higher figure."

Church Colleges Best
After having proven the value of
education the speaker spoke of the
worth of religious education. He took
134 of the most prominent men in
the state of Nebraska. Seventy had
been trained by religious or denom-
inational colleges, eighteen by state
universities, one by a state agricul-
tural college, and the remainder had
not received collegiate educations.
