OREGON ELECTRIC OFFICIALS LOOKING OVER THIS FIELD

Extensions for Immediate Future are to be Decided Upon

Here to look over the Oregon Electric line, in which he is heavily interested, W. A. White of the New York banking firm of Moffatt & White, arrived in the city yesterday and will remain until Friday, says the Oregonian. His son, Harold, accompanies him. Here also is William S. Barstow, head of the engineering firm of Barstow & C. New York, that built the Oregon Electric and is now putting in Portland's underground electric system. Mr. White comes to decide on work to be taken up during the coming summer on the trolley system, and Mr. Barstow is here to see what progress is being made on the underground conduit work. Both will have a great deal to say about the new work during the year. They are going over the line of the Oregon Electric today and will outline what work is to be undertaken during the next few days. They would not authorize announcements yesterday of extensions or improvements.

Tillamook Line.
There are to be no further delays in the construction of the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company's line to Tillamook from Hillsboro, according to E. E. Lytle, who is in charge of the construction of the road for the Harriman interests. Now that the spring season is opening and better weather may be expected for the next six months, construction gangs will be increased. It is hoped to complete the road by the end of the present year.

As was expected, large appropriations for the work during the summer have been allowed by the Harriman general offices in Chicago. An appropriation of \$2,000,000 has been set aside for the completion of the road.

AMUSEMENTS

It is asserted by persons competent to judge that the work of the Iowa College Glee Club, of Grinnell, which sings in Eugene Saturday night, is probably not excelled by that of any other college glee club in the country. The glee club at Grinnell is the most popular organization, membership in it is more coveted than membership in any other of the student organizations, athletic, social, literary or musical. The club, which has had a continuous organization for fifteen years, has had but three directors during this time and these have all been trained musicians, directors of or teachers in the Grinnell School of Music. This makes possible a continuity of work which most college clubs do not secure. Rehearsals are held about three times a week on the average practically during the whole school year; the musical standards which the club has established for itself are high and a high degree of excellence has been secured as a result. Concert trips are made each year during the Christmas and Easter vacations, though never before has the club been so far from home as on the present trip. Trip programs are carefully selected with a view to satisfying the most critical musicians, and at the same time pleasing those who expect to find at a glee club concert lively singing and a large element of college fun. In addition to the chorus singing, violin and vocal solos will be features of the program.
