## AMERICANS OPENED TODAY

Big League Will Start Playing Ball if Weather Permits

New York, April 12.—Weather permitting, the season of the American league season will be opened today with Boston playing at Philadelphia and New York at Washington. Cleveland and St. Louis will open the season in the West with a game at St. Louis Wednesday and Chicago will open the same day at Detroit.

The present season is the tenth in the history of the American league. The cities which have been component parts of the league in the decade of its existence are Chicago, Milwaukee, Indianapolis, Detroit, Kansas City, Cleveland, Buffalo, Minneapolis, Philadelphia, Baltimore, St. Louis, Boston and New York. Chicago has won the pennant three times and Boston and Philadelphia have two pennants each to their credit.

## FROM SEATTLE TO BOSTON

By Balloon if Captain Baldwin Can Stay in the Air

Since the very latest types of the airship and the big modern gasbags are to be exhibited at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition at Seattle this summer, and numerous flights and tests will be made, Captain Baldwin, to further demonstrate that to manage a balloon in long flights is one of the great scientific problems of the day, proposes to make a balloon flight from Seattle to Boston.

This is the longest balloon trip ever attempted, and if attempted will be the greatest in history. While the date for the start has not yet been set, it is expected that Captain Baldwin will leave the grounds during the coming summer, at a time when atmospheric conditions are right.

Captain Baldwin will take this haphazard voyage through space not because he is in search of adventure, but because there is a scientific purpose behind it all. H. Helm Clayton, of the Blue Hill observatory, one of the most noted experts of atmospheric conditions in the world, is behind the proposed Baldwin ballooning expedition from Seattle to Boston.

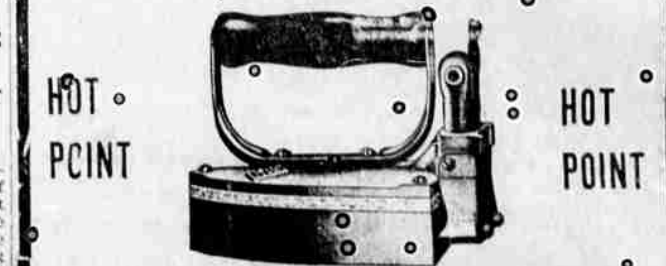
