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KLAMATH FALLS WILL CELEBRATE COMING OF ROAD

Klamath Falls, April 14.—The chamber of commerce is laying plans for a big celebration on the inauguration of service into this city by the railroad. The people of this city and the entire county are enthusiastic. The chamber of commerce has decided upon a fund of \$500 to be used in advertising and for attractions on the date of the event. The citizens are contributing liberally to the fund, and railroad week will be an epochal occasion in the history of the county.

Tents and camping grounds will be arranged for the accommodation of 200 people. With the assistance of the railroads, excursions are planned from Portland, San Francisco and Sacramento. It is expected that during railroad week fully 10,000 people will be in the city. One of the attractions will be an old-fashioned Indian village on the outskirts of town. Two or three hundred Indians, with their families and ponies, will be camped close to the city, and will hold daily parades and Indian pony races.

Grand Water Carnival
A grand water carnival for the evening is being arranged. Hundreds of craft will participate in the parade, and each will be decorated and illuminated with lanterns and red fire. The city is beautifully situated for this purpose, overlooking Lake Ewauna. Excursions to Holland on the railroad and the steamboats will be run for the benefit of the people from the country.

Other details of the celebration have not been worked out, but the people are entering into the affair have given up the Fourth of July and other celebrations to devote their funds and efforts to make the railroad celebration an unqualified success.

REGENTS FINALLY DECIDE TO BUY THE CONDON COLLECTION

Professor Thomas Condon's vast collection of geological specimens is to be purchased by the University of Oregon for \$15,000, says the Oregon Journal. At the meeting of the board of directors held this morning, it was decided that the university should purchase the collection for the use of the university. The Condon museum is perhaps the most complete collection of geological specimens and data dealing with the geological formation and evolution of the Pacific Coast region in existence. It was gathered by Professor Condon during his lifetime, and represents the labor of 40 years or more.

Included in the collection are the remains of a prehistoric horse discovered by the professor on the John Day river. This was discovered during a trip made by the professor to that region many years before his death, and at the time was given the prominence and was considered to be one of the most important geological discoveries of recent times.

The collection is now owned by Professor Condon's family at Eugene.

FACULTY CENSURE DEFERRED TO JUNE MEETING OF REGENTS

The question of censure for the University faculty in the Bristol investigation was late yesterday afternoon referred to a meeting in June. In this case there will probably be nothing done with the matter. Consideration of the report occupied more than three hours. There was a long discussion over the adoption of the minority or majority report, and another discussion on the question of punishment. In the vote on adopting the majority report the board voted seven to two.

The discussion of severity of punishment ranged from the suggestion of one day's suspension to expulsion. The majority of the board, however, thought that the case, in view of the findings, did not warrant an extreme penalty and they believed that the punishment should be more than nominal.

Politics and Politicians

A. O. Eberhardt, lieutenant governor of Minnesota, is spoken of as a possible candidate for governor next year.

Samuel J. Gilmore, Democrat, has been elected to Congress from the Second Louisiana District, succeeding the late Robert Davy.

Virginia Republicans are becoming active in anticipation of the state campaign soon to begin. At present a suitable candidate for governor is being sought.

Edward W. Durant, who President Taft has appointed collector of customs at Charleston, S. C., is forty-five years old and a native of Minnesota. He is a graduate of the Sheffield Scientific School.

The Prohibition national committee, displeased at the action of the Iowa legislature in defeating the proposed prohibition constitutional amendment, purpose to make the Hawkeye State the chief battle ground for the anti-saloon fight next year.

Major D. W. Lawler of St. Paul, proposes to create a city cabinet by appointing an advisory committee of fifty prominent business and professional men to act as advisors in the administration of municipal affairs.

Hon. Horace Chilton, former United States senator from Texas, has been asked by Governor Campbell of that state to accept the place on the state railroad commission left vacant by the recent death of Judge Douglas J. Storey.

Governor Hadley, of Missouri, expresses the opinion that one of the political possibilities of the near future will be a titanic struggle between the Democratic and Republican parties for the control of the South's electoral votes.

A well defined movement is said to be under way to dislodge Col. Cecil Lyon from the leadership of the Republican organization in Texas. A conference of the opposition leaders is to be held soon to take definite action in the matter.

Ormsby M. Bagg, the new assistant secretary of commerce and labor, is credited to North Dakota, but he has been in Washington for many years. For some years he was an instructor in law at Washington University, and recently has been a prominent part in the investigation of land frauds in the West.

George H. Moses, who has been appointed minister to Greece and Montenegro, has been a prominent figure for many years in New Hampshire political life. He was a delegate to the last national Republican convention at Chicago and was an ardent supporter of Vice President Fairbanks for the presidential nomination.

Representative Hughes of New Jersey has been appointed as the "whip" of the Democratic party by Champ Clark, the Democratic leader. Mr. Hughes succeeds Representative O'Connell of Massachusetts. The party "whip" has a lot to do. It is his duty to ascertain as nearly as possible the sentiment of the members of his party on all pending legislation, depending on party action, and to see that the entire membership of his party is present when the vote is taken on the question.

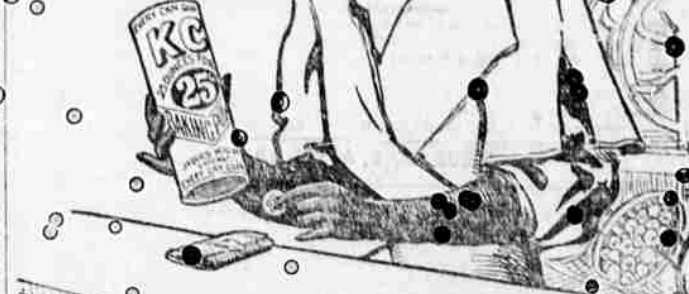

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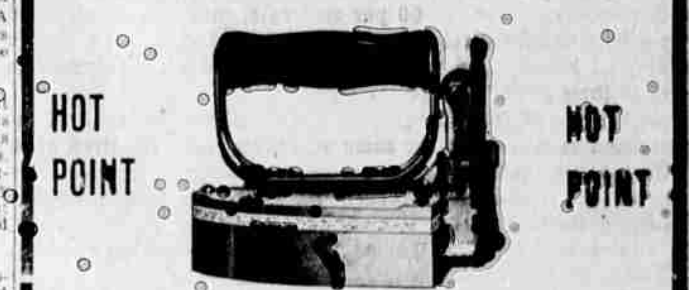
