FRANCHISE FOR ELECTRIC PLANT TURNED DOWN

Council Indefinitely Postpones Chambers' Application for Electric Right

The Chambers' franchise for an electric light system in Eugene was indefinitely postponed at the council meeting last night. The franchise was unfavorably reported by Chairman Garrett of the committee to which the matter was referred. The grounds of the action were that five years to construct the plant was too long a time. He also said that there is no evidence that Chambers would at once install the plant.

The council also decided last evening to endeavor to get rental from the Warren Construction Company for the rock that has been taken from Skinner's butte and the use of the land. The city has no copy of the contract which was originally made between the Willamette Valley Company and the construction company, and one will be gotten from the Willamette Valley Company if possible. The paving company is said to owe \$1200 to the city for rock taken from the quarry when there was some doubt as to who had title to the Skinner's butte property.

A paving inspector was also ordered appointed by the council. Rumors of poor work on the part of the Warren people had reached the council.

Street Improvements. A petition for graveling Monroe street from Fourth to Third and of Third street from Monroe west three of four blocks to Blair, was presented by Pennington and others, and referred to the street committee.

Councilman Roach, of the street committee, reported favorably on the petition for improvement by grading and graveling of Agate avenue from East Thirteenth street south to the city limits. Collier street, through the Gross addition from Eighteenth to Twenty third street, East Twentieth street, from Agate avenue to University avenue, and Twenty-first street from Fairmount boulevard to University avenue. The council adopted the report.

The council also passed a motion that Monroe street, from West Eighth to West Thirteenth streets, be graded and gravelled. This street is the entrance to the fair grounds. Another motion was passed to grade and gravel West Tenth street west of Monroe.

An ordinance was presented and passed, with an emergency clause attached, extending the cement sidewalk district eastward one block. The ordinance provides that hereafter only cement sidewalks, at least five feet in width, shall be laid.

Other Business. The Kelsay private water system in the south part of town will be attached to the city system. There are about twenty water users on the private line.

Councilman Garrett reported that the boring made in Fairmount for a well, showed that the well would run but 2 1/2 gallons to the minute, or 43,200 gallons to the day. This is insufficient for the city.

H. E. Morris petitioned the council for permission to lay a private sewer near Fourth and Lincoln streets. The sewer committee was given power to act.

The plat of Maple Croft addition to Eugene was approved.

An ordinance providing that breeding stations be kept at the fair grounds was passed.

Mayor Matlock stated that suit would be commenced against W. Simmons, if settlement was not soon made for \$350 due the city on account of an injunction suit.

City Attorney Pipes recommended that Attorney L. E. Bean be paid \$350 for his services in the water bond suits before the supreme court. The city attorney thought the bill not exorbitant, and that it was only just.

The council will meet again April 26.

Penalty Clause

Salem, April 15.—Owing to the omission of a penalty clause in a law passed by the last legislature, regulating salmon fishing in the Umpqua river, the law is inoperative. The text follows:

Section 4063.—It shall be unlawful to take or fish for salmon in the Umpqua river, or any of the bays or tributaries thereof, below the point hereinafter named, from April 1 to May 10, and from November 20 to December 10 of any year, or to take or fish for salmon by any means whatever, except with hook and line, commonly called angling, and for propagating purposes, above the points specified on each stream, namely, North Fork, above a point 600 feet below the dam at Winchester, South Fork above the south boundary of the town of Roseburg.

FAMOUS DOG-WOLF COMING WITH CIRCUS

Hero of Jack London's "Call of the Wild" With Norris & Rowe

Few people who have read Jack London's famous book, "The Call of the Wild," have forgotten "Buck," the lovable dog who is the hero of the story and whose career the author traces from day the animal was kidnapped from his master's home in the Santa Clara valley until the time when he descends mankind and joins the wolf packs of the frozen north. It will be remembered that London gives "Buck" at the head of the dog's ferocious ancestors, their chosen leader and the wisest of the pack.

It is a far cry from that glacier-strewn valley where London gives his reader his last glimpse of "Buck" to the menagerie of the greater Norris & Rowe circus, and yet, unbelievable as it may seem, there is caged in that menagerie a wolf-dog that will might have been the hero of "The Call of the Wild." Rowe, is at all times on the look-out for unusual animals, LeRoy had the captive sent to the circus headquarters at Santa Cruz, Cal. "Kon" is now one of the most beautiful exhibits of the entire menagerie. Men long experienced in handling wild animals are convinced that he is the most unusual type of wolf they have ever seen. He is the fiercest and strongest of the band of wolves that Norris & Rowe carry with them. Mr. Frank Williams, "Kon's" special keeper and a man noted for his ability to tame the wildest of animals, has taken a keen interest in his new charge. Talking of the animal, he said:

"I have long been interested in London's novel. I am convinced that a dog subjected to the conditions imposed in 'The Call of the Wild' would retrograde to the absolute wild state. I am also convinced that such a dog could be re-tamed. If 'Kon' was indeed, once domesticated, I shall bring him back to that state."
