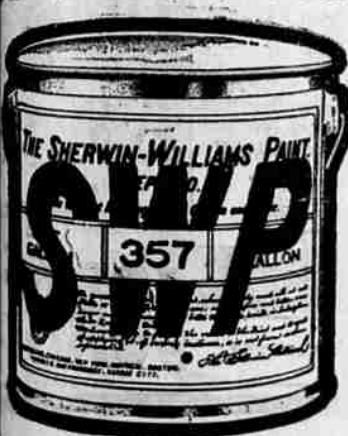

## FASTEST DESTROYER IS LAUNCHED TODAY

Philadelphia, April 20.—The torpedo boat destroyer Smith, the first of a new type of vessel and which is expected to have a greater speed and a wider steaming radius than any now in the United States navy, was successfully launched today at Cramps' shipyard. The christening ceremony was performed by Mrs. Edward B. Richardson, of Brookline, Mass. Mrs. Richardson is a daughter of Rear Admiral Pillsbury and a distant relative of Lieut. B. Smith, in memory of whom the vessel launched today was named. Lieut. Smith was a distinguished officer of the navy during the civil war period and was in command of the warship Congress when that vessel was sunk in Hampton Roads by the Confederate ironclad Virginia.
