STOLE CLOTHES AND FORGED AN ORDER
Officers Looking for John Doe, Accused of Petty Larceny and Forgery
The sheriff's force is looking for a John Doe, accused by Chas. Smith, a painter, of stealing a suit of clothes from the latter and of forging his name to an order for \$2.50, on Chas. Jensen, proprietor of the People's restaurant.
Smith, who rooms at the restaurant, missed his clothes this morning, and at once notified the sheriff. A warrant was issued for the arrest of John Doe, the fellow's true name not being known. After the clothes were missed it was found that Doe wrote an order requesting the restaurant proprietor to give him \$2.50 and signing Smith's name to it.
Sheriff Bowen left on the noon train for the north to look for the man, believing he had gone that way.
Caught At Junction.
Sheriff Bowen caught the man at Junction City and brought him back to Eugene. He gives the name of Charles Gardner. He was taken before Justice of the Peace Bryson and bonded over to the circuit court on the charge of larceny in a public building.
