

WILL BUILD BEAUTIFUL HOME IN ROSEBURG

Hon. and Mrs. J. H. Booth Have Secured Plans for a Handsome Residence

Hon. and Mrs. J. H. Booth have just received from Architect R. Martin, Jr., of Portland, the detailed plans and specifications for a very beautiful and commodious residence to be erected by them this season on their very shady grounds in the Candwick addition to this city. A glance at these plans at once shows that this elegant home, when completed, will surpass any now existing in Southern Oregon in its appearance, completeness and appointments, and will compare favorably with the best modern residence in Portland or elsewhere.

The interior finishings will be made by the Northwest Door Co., of Portland, in which Mr. Booth is a stockholder, and every piece will be personally selected. The lumber will mostly come from the Booth-Kelly mill and the stone will be a local product. Everything that goes into the structure will be of the highest class. Contracts for the several parts of the work are already tentatively agreed upon, and Winnie Gaddis will have charge of the plumbing. The entire cost is estimated at something like \$17,000. Roseburg will be proud to have erected here such a beautiful home.—Roseburg Review

START ANOTHER SUIT AGAINST BIG MERGER

San Francisco, April 21.—The president of the United States is named as complainant in a suit filed in the United States circuit court in the Northern District of California today, the object of which is to dissolve the financial relations of the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific railroads.

Hundreds of witnesses are subpoenaed under authority of Chief Justice Fuller, of the United States supreme court. The action is one of the numerous suits brought against the Harriman lines during the Roosevelt administration. It is to be the first inaugurated by President Taft. It was originally brought in Utah and hearings are held in every large city where the two roads own property or competing agencies.
