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W. C. T. U. COLUMN

Three years ago, when this column was started, it required about two days to hunt up available temperance news to fill the small space allowed us, but now event follows event with such rapid succession that before the items are boiled down to fit they are stale, and scarcely news at all. The great dailies and other periodicals that erstwhile were silent as claims on temperance news have many of them not only given their columns now for prohibition discussion, but have editorially endorsed these reform measures. And so our present conditions remind us somewhat of the story of the "Arkansas traveler," when we would we could not, and when we can it is scarcely worth while. However, as we are dry we would better try to continue to stay so, for "the world do move."

Yes, and the business men seem to move also. Out in Milwaukee, Wis., the brewers' paradise, President Samuel Dickie, of Abraham College, Mich., met and debated with Mayor Rose, of that city, on the question of prohibition. The prohibition associated press gives the following:

"For the first time in the annals of the great reform nearly 4000 bus-

nessmen supposed to be largely unfriendly to the prohibition cause and including among them representatives of the most prominent business and commercial interests of a great city, heard the message of the prohibitionist from the lips of a distinguished champion. Strange and incongruous as it may seem, almost without exception every concrete argument of the prohibition advocate was received by this body of men with cheers, frequently with unrestrained enthusiasm."

Some of the statements made by Mayor Rose were extraordinary. One was that "every minister of the gospel who teaches prohibition degrades the sanctity of the pulpit," and "prohibition causes more crime than the liquor traffic," and "prohibition increases pauperism."

Arrangements are being made for these two men to meet again in Chicago on April 30.

Mrs. Hosmer, the state Sunday school superintendent of the W. C. T. U., reports temperance Sunday well observed. She had received over 50 reports from as many schools to that effect.

Chicago University Freak Says
Uncle Sam is Bunkoing
the People at Panama

Chicago, April 23.—Ridiculing the government for "pretending to believe the Panama canal could be a commercial success," Professor Frederick Starr of the University of California has made a sensational statement.

"The canal will cost more than we now realize," declared the professor. "The government will soon find that it has not reckoned with its host, as it were. It cannot expect the canal will be a commercial success. Rival routes undoubtedly will retain the supremacy."

"In my opinion the Panama canal is being built as a military necessity. The government is loud in its protestations of peace toward all nations, but it always assures itself plenty of military protection."

BOOKLET IS ISSUED

BY OREGON ELECTRIC

W. S. Barstow & Co., engineers of the Oregon Electric railway system, have issued a handsome booklet containing photographs, maps and descriptions of the work done by the company on the lines of the Oregon Electric, as well as technical descriptions of the electrification of the line.

The most interesting part of the book to the public is the map of the proposed extension of the system. These show a line running south from Salem to Albany, Junction City, Eugene and Roseburg, completely covering the Willamette valley, and reaching into the upper Umpqua.

The lines show a continuation of the Forest Grove line to Tillamook; a branch running from Garden Home to McMinnville, Dallas, Corvallis, and joining the Eugene line at Junction City; a line from Salem to Dallas; one from Salem to Mill City; and one from Albany to Cascade.

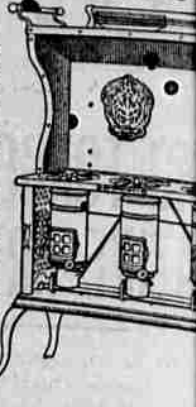

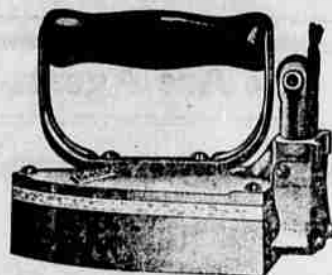
