**IRRIGATION COMPANY
WANTS FRANCHISE**

Will Apply to Springfield City
Council—Other
News

The McKenzie Valley Irrigation & Power company, who propose to construct a plant for the development of power through electricity generated by water power will apply to the town council of Springfield shortly, for the franchise to convey and to sell such current of electricity through the streets of Springfield. The franchise will be considered by the council as soon as presented and will no doubt be granted.

The first car of cement for the Charles Rivett concrete block has arrived and work on the building will probably be commenced next week. The plans have been completed by the architect and have been accepted by Mr. Rivett. Geo. Perkins, one of the owners of the Springfield planing mill, sold his half interest this week to R. L. Drewsey of Marcola. Mr. Drewsey has been connected for some time with the Fischer & Bally mill at Marcola and it is generally understood that the planing mill will run in connection with the new mill. The building will be 40x120 in dimensions, two stories and will have two fine store rooms.

A black team belonging to Bangs livery in Eugene ran away yesterday afternoon while in Springfield. They were driven by two traveling men and it seems that in driving through a mud hole in North Springfield, the double-trees broke and the horses then succeeded in getting away from the driver. They came up Fourth street at a break-neck gait till they got to Main and in turning the corner they slipped on the pavement and fell. Bystanders caught them and the excitement was over. No damage was done further than the bruising of one of the animals in the fall.

**NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS
AND PROPERTY OWNERS.**

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the terms of Ordinance No. 538, passed by the common council of the City of Eugene, February 1st, 1909, bids will be received by the street committee of the Council in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Eugene, until 7:30 o'clock p. m., on Tuesday, May 4th, 1909, for the improvement of Oak street from Ninth street to Eleventh street in the City of Eugene, by the construction of cement curbing along both sides of said street and by paving the said streets between said points with bitulithic, asphalt, or other hard surface pavement in accordance with plans and specifications therefor now on file in the office of the City Recorder.

Bidders are required to state the price in detail in accordance with the plans and specifications, and on the form prepared by the City Engineer. Separate contracts will be awarded to the lowest bidder for the construction of said curbing; for paving and for drainage; the said improvement shall be completed within ninety days from the date of letting the contract therefor.

The work to be done under the supervision of the street committee and to be approved by them. An approved bond will be required of each contractor for the faithful performance of the contract. A certified check in a sum equal to five per cent of the amount bid, payable to J. D. Matlock, Mayor, is required to accompany each bid. The street committee reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

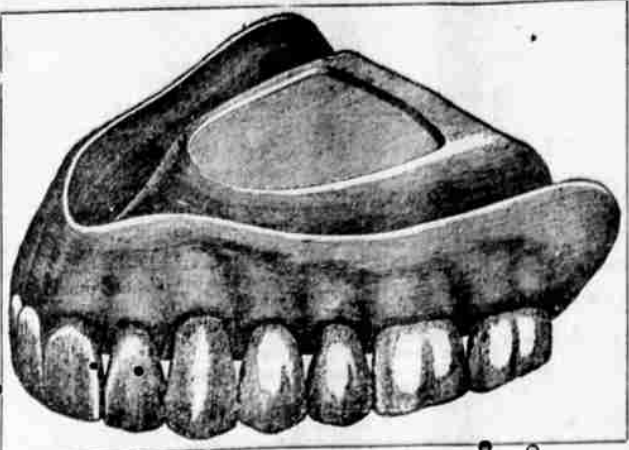
