KINDERGARTEN EXPERTS IN SESSION

Great International Convention
in the City or Buffalo,
New York

Buffalo, N. Y., April 26.—Five
hundred experts in the work of train-
ing baby minds have gathered in
Buffalo for the sixteenth annual con-
vention of the International Kinder-
garten Union. The delegates come
from all parts of the United States
and from Canada, Australia, Mexico
and Japan. Several committee meet-
ings were held today, preliminary to
the beginning of the regular work of
the convention tomorrow. The gath-
ering will continue three days, dur-
ing which time an instructive pro-
gram of addresses, papers and discus-
sions will be carried out.

The International Kindergarten
Union is an offshoot from the Nation-
al Educational Association, with
which it was affiliated until 1895,
when it became a separate organiza-
tion. It was started in Saratoga in
1892 as a branch of the educational
association, but it grew so rapidly
that it soon became necessary to
make it a separate organization.
