ALLEGED FORGER CAUGHT AT SISSONS

Man Who Was to Have Bought
Roseburg Hotel a
Swindler

Roseburg Or., April 29.—A stranger, giving the name of Frank Meyers, who passed a bogus check drawn on Ladd & Tilton, of Portland, on the First National Bank of this city, is under arrest at Sisson, Cal., for which place Constable Ryan left tonight to bring him to this city.

Meyers has been in the city for a week pretending to be a real estate firm that he wished to buy a hotel, and he had negotiated a deal for the leading hotel in the city at a price of about \$40,000. He gave his home as Fort Collins, Colo., but advices received from other cities prove him to be much wanted on forgery charges, especially in California. He left this city this morning and this evening was apprehended at Sisson.

Meyers came to Roseburg on Sunday evening, April 18, and had been here ever since. He was a very quiet, genteel fellow, well-dressed, and was known to have a small sum of money in his pocket. He first negotiated for the purchase of the "Jack" Booth farm, near the District Fair grounds, and in conjunction he carried on negotiations for the purchase of the Hotel McCallen, both through the agency of Stewart & Beals, the local real estate men. These negotiations he carried on in such a thorough and systematic manner that there seemed no question as to his sincerity. He examined every detail of the hotel business and spent at least two days in taking a complete inventory of the supplies on hand. He also mapped out an extensive system of improvements on the hotel building and premises and had local contractors furnish estimates of the cost of same.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the terms of Ordinance No. 548, passed by the common council of the City of Eugene, February 1st, 1909, bids will be received by the street committee of the Council in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Eugene, until 7:30 o'clock p. m., on Tuesday, May 4th, 1909, for the improvement of Oak street from Ninth street to Eleventh street in the City of Eugene, by the construction of cement curbing along both sides of said street and by paving the said streets between said points with bitulithic, asphalt, or other hard surface pavement in accordance with plans and specifications therefor now on file in the office of the City Recorder.

Bidders are required to state the price in detail in accordance with the plans and specifications, and on the form prepared by the City Engineer. Separate contracts will be awarded to the lowest bidder for the construction of said curbing; for paving and for drainage; the said improvement shall be completed within ninety days from the date of letting the contract therefor.

The work to be done under the supervision of the street committee and to be approved by them. An approved bond will be required of each contractor for the faithful performance of the contract. A certified check in a sum equal to five per cent of the amount bid, payable to J. D. Matlock, Mayor, is required to accompany each bid. The street committee reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
