MAGNIFICENT NEW STEAMSHIP SAILS ON FIRST VOYAGE

Liverpool, April 29.—Amidst loud cheers from a large assemblage, the magnificent new triple screw steamship *Laurentic*, of the White Star Line, sailed out from this port on her maiden voyage to Quebec and Montreal. The event was a notable one, and the many Canadians and friends of Canada in the mother country made it a red letter day. The steamship sailed with a full passenger list and a large cargo of freight.

The *Laurentic*, which was recently completed at Belfast, is propelled both by reciprocating and turbine engines. Her departure marks the inauguration of the White Star-Dominion Line's new Canadian service. She will be followed by the new *Megantic* in June. These two vessels will be the largest employed on the St. Lawrence service.

FOUR-LEAF CLOVER IN PLENTY MEANS LUCK TO FINDER

The crop of four leaf clovers is unusually plentiful in Eugene this year, and if the tradition of luck continues to follow the finders there will be many happy towns and college maidens in 1909. DRY TERRITORY INCREASED IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Concord, N. H., May 1.—The changes resulting from last fall's referendum on the liquor question in New Hampshire were put into effect today, with the result that the prohibition territory in this state is largely increased. There are now but 25 of the 230 towns in New Hampshire in which saloons or wholesale liquor places can be maintained. These 25 towns had a total population of but 23,407, according to the last census. The total population of all the towns in the state was about 230,000, so that as regards the towns by population, more than seven-eighths of them are now no-license. Six of the eleven cities, having an aggregate population of 59,000, are also no-license, so that including the large cities, about two-thirds of all the people of the state are living in no-license territory.

PILGRIM MEMORIAL MOVEMENT GROWS

Provincetown, Mass., May 1.—Work was resumed this week upon the Pilgrim Memorial Monument, which is being erected on Town Hill to mark the first-landing place of the Pilgrims. The tower has now reached a height of nearly 200 feet. The entire height will be 350 feet above the ground level, or 350 feet above the level of the sea. It is believed that the walls, belfry and roof will be completed before the Fourth of July, and that the entire structure will be completed before next winter. The monument probably will be dedicated in the summer of 1910, upon the anniversary of the sailing of the Pilgrim company from Southampton. President Taft has been invited to be present on that occasion and he has accepted provisionally.

OPERA TO AID JEFFERSON MONUMENT

Washington, D. C., May 1.—To aid in the erection of a monument in Central Park, New York, to perpetuate the memory and art of Joseph Jefferson, there is to be given a programme of grand opera and vaudeville extraordinary in the large ballroom of the Arlington hotel tonight. Prominent among those actively interested in the project are Andrew Carnegie, Cornelius H. Bliss, Levi P. Morton, W. Bourke Cochran, David Belasco, Harrison Grey Fiske, Henry Dixey, DeWolf Hopper, Henry Miller, Otis Skinner and Nat. C. Goodwin.

CHINESE EMPEROR'S BURIAL IMPOSING

Peking, May 1.—The burial of the late Emperor took place today and was accompanied by ceremonies of a most imposing character. The event was attended by all the high officials of the Chinese Government and by special ambassadors sent by various governments. The United States was represented by Mr. Rockhill, the American minister in Peking.
