SNOW CRUSHES BUILDINGS IN CRATER RESERVE

Klamath Falls, Or., May 2.—Superintendent Arant, of the Crater Lake National Park, has received word from Fort Klamath that Mr. Scott, of that place, who recently returned through the park, reports that practically all of the buildings have been broken down by the heavy snow of last winter. There is now about ten feet of snow in the Arant camp, which is five miles below the lake. Mr. Wheeler, who trapped on the head of the Umpqua last winter, states that the snow was the heaviest in that section that it had been for many years. He is of the opinion that there was fully 25 feet of snow at the Arant camp.

There were a residence, barn, shop and toolshed and a number of smaller buildings at the Arant camp, and near there Mr. Steel had a log cook building. It is said that every one of these are down with the exception of the tool building. The barn was rebuilt last year by Mr. McMillan, of this city, and was constructed of the heaviest timbers, being built to withstand the heaviest of storms. Mr. McMillan refuses to believe that the barn is down, as he says it was built as solid as a rock.

WALLOWA COUNTY WOOL CLIP SOLD IN ONE BIG LOT

Enterprise, May 2.—Ed Rumble, of LaGrande, has been in this country for the last several days and has bought for a San Francisco firm practically the whole of the Wallowa county wool clip, approximately 150,000 fleeces, at prices ranging from 18 to 25 cents per pound. About 20,000 fleeces brought 18 cents; 50,000 sold for 19 to 19 1/2, and the remainder the owners will realize 20 cents for.

About \$350,000 will be distributed in Wallowa county by these deals, and the sale of spring lambs in the fall.
