UNIVERSITY ALUMNI STAND BY CORVALLIS

The Portland Association of Uni-
versity of Oregon Alumni has gone on
record as opposing the invoking of
the referendum against the Oregon
Agricultural College. Last night the
association drew up resolutions ex-
pressing its friendly feelings for the
college. The appropriation is called
"reasonable and proper," and it is
set forth that the referendum "would
seriously cripple the effective work
and development of the college for
two years. The alumni pledges it-
self to give the appropriation its
support at the polls if the referendum
petitions are filed.

The University of Oregon passed
through the same trouble a year ago
concerning its own appropriation and
realizes that the institution was plac-
ed practically at a standstill while
the decision was pending. Therefore,
in spite of the rivalry existing be-
tween the two institutions, it has
quickly shown its sympathy and good
wishes.—Journal.

JUDGE BEAN TO HOLD COURT IN MONTANA

United States District Judge Bean
will leave tomorrow for Montana,
where he will hold court in the ab-
sence of Judge Hunt, who is now
serving as one of the members of the
circuit court of appeals in San Fran-
cisco. In all probability Judge Bean
will remain there until June, when
Judge Hunt will return. A term of
federal court will hereafter be held
annually at both Pendleton and Med-
ford, at which Judge Bean may pre-
side. The term at Pendleton will be
opened June 7, and arrangements will
soon be made to send a deputy United
States court clerk there for the pur-
pose of receiving and filing official
documents. Miss Gabrielle Clark, of
Salem, was yesterday appointed sten-
ographer and deputy in the office of
United States District Court Clerk
Cannon, and will probably be station-
ed permanently in Portland.—Tele-
gram.
