\$105,000 PAID FOR 100 ACRES AT HOOD RIVER

Hood River, Or., May 5.—The largest land deal ever made in the Hood River Valley was closed today, when Burt Van Horn, of New York, sold to Edwin R. Pooley, of Philadelphia, 100 acres of orchard for \$105,000.

This includes 35 acres of bearing orchard, the balance of the trees ranging from 2 to 6 years old. Although steadily back him up in his starting to produce a full crop, the trees being mostly 7 and 8 years old, it has produced 18,000 boxes of apples in the last four years, which have sold from \$2 to \$3.25 per box.

Last summer Mr. Van Horn sold 40 acres to Dickerson & Peck, of Minneapolis, for \$34,000 and 10 acres to William R. Starrett, of New York for \$9,000. The gross sales made during the past eight months amount to \$187,000.

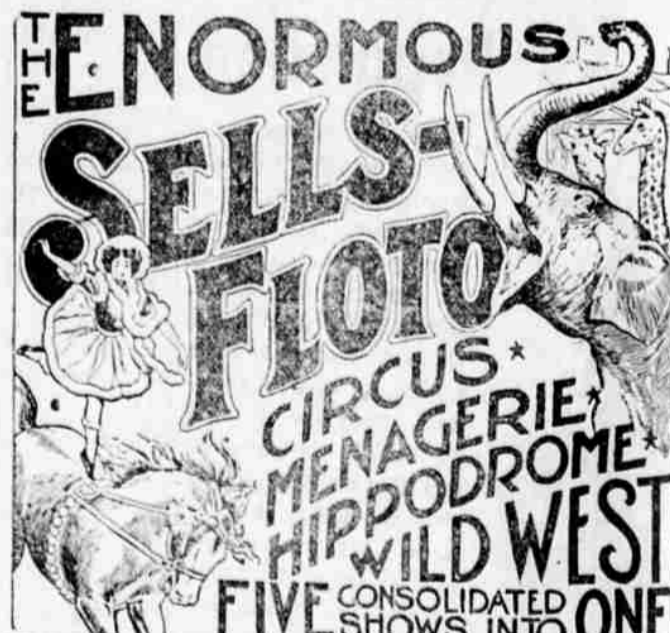
