Charter is to be Amended in Order to Give Council Power to Condemn Land

The special election on Monday, May 10, is very important. Let every taxpayer give attention.

The circuit court has ruled that the city council must be authorized by a vote of the taxpayers to bring the condemnation suit for the right-of-way for the power canal through the Millican land, or that it might be by an amendment to the city charter. The latter spells delay.

If the right to condemn should be held up for any length of time it would be prejudicial to the best interests of the city. It would mean useless waste of time and money expended. If authorized forthwith the plant can be completed before wet weather. Hence the need of and call for a special election.

Delay means further excessive pumping charges.

Every taxpayer should take heed and go to the polls next Monday, and by his vote direct the early consummation of the proceedings now under way.
