### TRACK TEAMS HERE FOR CITY'S BIGGEST MEET

Triangular Tomorrow May Continue to be Held in Eugene.

The triangular track meet tomorrow among the universities of Idaho, Washington and Oregon is the biggest meet ever held in Eugene, and the question will be put after the attendance is counted of the place for the meet next year. Since the formation of the league the meet has been held at Seattle, but this year as a conference affair will also be pulled off there, and as the gate receipts were always small in the Sound City, the University management succeeded in having the meet held in Eugene.

If the box office shows enough receipts to pay the expenses, in all likelihood the meet will continue to be held in Eugene. Trainer Hayward will not have his team officially selected until this evening or in the morning. A team was published yesterday in several papers, and while the personnel will probably be almost the same there may be some differences.

Both Idaho and Washington will arrive either this afternoon or this evening. The twelve Washington men will be chosen from the following squad: Marsh, Campbell, Willis, Williams, Waite, Vernon, Berge, Smith, Severyne, Bowman, Brokaw, Evans, Rabel, Kerr, Harrison, Thayer, Coyle, Bantz, Jarvis, Babcock, and Greene.

The men in the Idaho team will be 100-yd. dash—Montgomery, Fenn and Flugart; 880-yard run—Denny Strohecker and Jessup; pole vault—Strohecker; shot—Jewell and Frazier; 220-yd. dash—Montgomery, Fenn and Flugart; 120-yd. hurdles—Driscoll, Flugart and Fenn; broad jump—Flughart and Strohecker; hammer—Jewell and Frazier; 440-yd. run—Montgomery, Jessup and Ream; mile—Jessup, Price and Denny; high jump—Strohecker and Driscoll; discus—Jewell and Frazier; 220-yd. hurdles—Montgomery, Flugart and Fenn; relay—McInturf, Jessup, Ream, Montgomery or Flugart.

### BASEBALL LINE-UPS FOR SATURDAY

Changes in Oregon Team to Strengthen Squad.

The Oregon baseball team will be lined up Saturday against O. A. C. practically the same as in the last Multnomah game, though McKenzie has not yet gotten back in the game on third base, and Dudley Clarke is holding the position down. Newland, a new man, will be on second base, and his work there is satisfactory.

"Red" Van Marter, one of the understudy pitchers, will go to the outfield, letting out one of the regular men. Inman, a comparative new man, is being given a tryout behind the bat, as Word has a badly sprained ankle.

The Agricultural College team will be made up of the following men: Catcher, Phillips; pitchers, Keene, Robinson and Reiben; first base, Freeman; second base, Horton; shortstop, Crews; third base,

Davis; and outfielders, Keck, Carroll and one of the pitchers. HAYWARD CONFIRMS CONTRACT Oregon Gets Half of All Receipts, Billboards, Grandstand and Other Things.

Physical Director Hayward of the University confirmed the report last night that Oregon had signed an agreement with the Multnomah club to play in Portland with the club eleven on Thanksgiving after next fall, when Multnomah plays in Eugene. The contract was made about two months ago, but was not made public for the sake of the standing of the club.

The agreement was the result of a three-cornered battle, according to Mr. Hayward, and the attempted coup that Director Angell of the Agricultural College tried to spring was the blessing that turned the tide to Hayward and Oregon. Hayward, from every evidence, played fair with Angell, and notified him of every conference he had with the Multnomah people, so that no complaint could be made. Angell, on the other hand, tried to get the club officials to agree to a three-year contract between Multnomah and the Agricultural College, without letting Hayward know of his plan.

"Bill" discovered the scheme before it had fully culminated and then made a direct effort and signed up the contract that was unofficially announced in The Guard and several other papers over a week ago.

By the conditions of contract Oregon also receives much better terms, and the friends of the veteran trainer are congratulating him on that portion of the contract. Oregon now gets fifty per cent of all the receipts, grandstand, bill board advertising and general admission. Each team must pay for all the complimentary tickets that it issues, and for all its own expenses. The rent is also paid from the gross receipts. Formerly Oregon did not receive anything from the grandstand, which holds 4200 people, and nothing from the bill boards. Moreover, the club members with season tickets were admitted to the game free of charge.

Hawkins Freshman Captain. Martin W. Hawkins has been chosen captain of the freshman track team. Hawkins won the 50-yard hurdles at the Multnomah indoor meet early in the year, and won the broad jump and third place in the hurdles at the Columbia meet. In Saturday's freshman meet he distinguished himself by running the high hurdles in 16 1-5 seconds, as well as taking two places in other events.
