NEW BUILDINGS FOR SPRINGFIELD**Work On Rivett Block Begins—Another Brick Building Contemplated.**

A move is now on foot by a company of four of our townsmen to erect a large concrete building on Main street, which will be 120x120 feet in dimensions, the corner building to be two stories and the other three store rooms but one, though they will be built so another story can be added at any time.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE TO CUT SIUSLAW TIMBER**Newspaper Figures That It Will Require a Great Many Years.**

How many people in this vicinity ever tried to reckon how long it will take to saw up all the timber in the Siuslaw valley that is suitable for milling purposes? If you will take a few minutes and do a little calculating in this direction you will very likely be surprised. The timber will last much longer than most people think. For example: According to estimates there are about fourteen billion feet of timber in the basin of the Siuslaw river. If enough mills should be built here to cut an average of one million feet of lumber per day, that would make three-hundred million feet in a year, allowing the mills to be idle twelve working days during that time. At that rate it would take three and one-third years to cut one billion feet; and to cut fourteen billion feet would take about forty-seven years or almost half a century. This would be handling lumber very fast and would require not only a large number of mills, but many vessels or other means of transportation to get the lumber to market. It would furnish employment to many thousands of men in the mills and logging camps and would keep many others busy raising vegetables and other farm produce to feed the mill hands and loggers. In short, it would mean many millions of dollars put into circulation here, most of which would first go to the laboring man.

B. F. Powers, a well-known pioneer of Springfield, died at his home near that city of heart trouble May 14, 1909 at 10:23 p. m. He was born in Alleghany county, New York, in 1826. He was a son of Benjamin B. and Mary Powell Powers. Mr. Powers crossed the plains with his parents in 1852, driving an ox team and walking the entire distance. Mr. Powers located on a donation claim near Springfield and engaged in farming. He was reared and educated in Illinois and was married near Springfield in 1864 to Mrs. Louisa M. Powell, daughter of Jonathan Thomas, a pioneer of 1852. They have one child, Mrs. C. E. Harkins, wife of Will Harkins, living on the home place at Springfield, and three step-children, Mrs. Mary Bolter, Springfield, Frank Powers, Springfield, and Will Powers, Seattle. He had three grand-children, Walter Morton, Walla Walla; Mrs. Frances Storms, Seattle, Wash., and Miss Ola Morton, Springfield, and one great-grand-child, Claire Storms, and thirteen step-grand children: Dessie Bolter, Nettie Bolter, Willie Bolter, Anna Bolter, Katie Bolter, Lizzie Bolter, Barbara Bolter, Melva McPherson, Harry Powers, Pearl Powers and Ethlyn Powers, all of Springfield; Effie Penman of Columbus, Mont., and Verne Powers.

The funeral service was held at the home place near Springfield at 10 o'clock a. m. Sunday, May 16.
