A THOUSAND ODD FELLOWS MARCH IN LINE

Largest attendance at Albany
In History of Grand
Lodge.

Albany, Or., May 19.—The Grand Lodge of Oregon, I. O. O. F., met in 54th annual convention in the Elks Temple in this city this morning and will remain in session for two days. Most of the forenoon session was spent in conferring the grand lodge degree on 145 past noble grandes from all parts of the state, the largest class ever initiated in the Grand Lodge of Oregon. There is a full attendance of delegates from all of the 211 subordinate lodges of the state. One thousand Odd Fellows marched through Albany's streets this afternoon in annual parade. The long procession was headed by the Albany band and the Patriarchs Militant in full uniform. Next came the Rebekahs and after them the Grand Lodge, 500 strong, and about 200 members of subordinating lodges.

Marching in the ranks was Frank W. Benson, Governor of Oregon, who arrived this forenoon to attend the Grand Lodge as a representative of the Roseburg lodge. It is said to be the first case on record where the Governor of a state attended a Grand Lodge session as a regularly elected delegate. Another interesting figure in the parade was Silas J. Day, of Jacksonville, the oldest living past grand master of the order. He resided over the grand lodge in 1865, when it included the states of Oregon, Washington, and Idaho in its jurisdiction.

tire day to routine business and the committees were very busy. A distinctive feature of this session is that there is a larger attendance than at any previous session in the 54 years of the order's history in Oregon. Scores of men high in the public and official life of Oregon are present. The fight for the next convention has simmered down to Portland and Eugene. The other candidates, Hood River, The Dalles and Ashland have dropped out of the race. The convention site will be selected tomorrow. Evidently Eugene is far in the lead and the choice of delegates will undoubtedly favor that booming little city. Everywhere can be seen badges bearing the words, "Eugene, 1910." These are a bright yellow and this delegation has so far shown more spirit and life than its rivals for the honor of entertaining the grand lodge next year.

Mrs. Carrie Hubbard of Independence, was elected president of the Rebekah assembly this afternoon to serve for the ensuing year. After Mrs. Addie Grout, of LaGrande, has been elected vice-president, the time for adjournment arrived and the election will be concluded tomorrow afternoon.
