IRRIGATION PROMISES MUCH FOR EUGENE

United States Government Topographic Report Gives Interesting Facts.

Advance sheets of a topographic map covering 138,000 acres of the Willamette valley between Eugene and Junction City have just been received. The area was surveyed during the summer of 1908 by the state engineer in co-operation with the United States Geological survey. The finished map will be published for distribution within the near future, and can be obtained for five cents a copy by addressing the U. S. Geological survey, Washington, D. C.

The map shows at a glance the irrigation and drainage possibilities of this section and will prove invaluable to the commercial interests of Eugene. It shows but one or two houses to the square mile. By promoting and encouraging the practice of irrigation and more intensive and diversified farming, this map should show from 30 to 50 houses to the square mile.

Work has begun during the past week on a survey of an equal area to the north of Junction City. The advance sheets are published on a scale of one and one-fourth inches to the mile. Lands in the valley are shown many contours of five foot interval with ten foot intervals in the hilly portion of the sheet. The maps are accurately drawn and will serve as a base for any engineering or other development work.

Rainfall Less Than Deserts. Bulletin 209 on "Irrigation in Oregon" recently issued by the department of irrigation investigations at

Washington, D. C., illustrates by diagram the need of irrigation in the Willamette valley. The striking feature brought out by this diagram is that the summer rainfall in the Willamette valley is much less than that which occurs in some arid regions, and far less than that which occurs in the eastern humid states. The average precipitation at Eugene during June, July and August, as shown by the government records, is but 2.6 inches as compared with 4.4 inches at Denver, 5 inches at Cheyenne, Wyo., and 6.2 inches at Santa Fe, New Mexico. This bulletin was written by John H. Lewis, state engineer, assisted by Percy A. Cupper, and contains much information on climate, soil, resources and irrigation possibilities of the state. It is of particular interest to the prospective settler and to those in the Willamette valley who contemplate irrigation.
