### HIGH SCHOOL TRACK TEAM HOPES TO WIN Eugene Athletes Go to Corvallis to Compete in the State Interscholastic Meet.

Eight high school track men left this noon to compete in the state interscholastic meet at Corvallis tomorrow. They left in high spirits and hope to bring back the state championship. The announcement that Hill Military Academy will be barred, because their men cannot qualify on account of their standing, has removed the most dangerous competitor. It is thought that the Eugene men are strong enough individually to bring in enough firsts to win the day. The boys have, with this thought in view, been training not for several races but for one alone, which is their strong race. Billy hopes to make a new high school record in the hammer. Kuykendall is expected to win the high hurdles and Ashbie will run a fast low hurdle race. Jenkins hopes to make places in both the 50-yard and 100-yard dashes.

George Hug, who has trained them and will be in a large degree responsible for the winning team, said this morning before leaving: "Since Hill has dropped out, I think that Eugene has the best chance in the state to win this meet. If they can do as well as they did last week, they will."
