NEWS OF LANE'S

SEAPORT TOWN

Several Vessels Arrive and Depart During Week—Other Notes of Interest.

The steamer Coquille arrived in Wednesday from San Francisco.

The Willamina came into the Umpqua a few days ago and took out a cargo of salmon from the cannery.

The schooners Mayflower and Alhambra sailed for the Bay City Monday morning with cargoes of lumber from the Acme mill.

E. Nicolle, of Mapleton, was in town Saturday marketing the last of his last year's crop of apples. This shows something of the keeping qualities of the fruit grown here.

Jimale Gurney and his sister Mary left Tuesday for Eugene. They expect to meet their mother there and go to Glendale, Douglas county, to reside.

William Smith, first assistant keeper at Heceta Lighthouse, left a few days ago for Portland, expecting to go to a hospital to be treated by a specialist.

The Washelore arrived in from San Francisco Saturday evening and went to sea Tuesday night with probably the largest cargo of lumber that vessel ever took over the bar. The boat began loading Monday morning and left Tuesday night, having exceedingly good luck.

The creamery here is shipping butter once a week to Portland. It is taken up the river on the steamer Monday afternoon then hauled out from Mapleton to the railroad by Louis Hunkler. The shipment for last Monday was about 4400 pounds, which will put nearly a thousand dollars into the pockets of the dairymen.

A few of the members of the dairymen's association met in town last Saturday and nominated ten men for delegates to attend the Port District convention at Mapleton on May 29. Those nominated are, J. S. Dale, Frank Knowles, O. C. Stanwood, E. H. McCornack, Wm. Jephcott, I. B. Cushman, W. H. Wenterson, Dr. Edwards, E. P. Waite and T. A. Yost.

Mr. McCullom, agent for the Southern Pacific at Marshfield, was in Florence Tuesday and Wednesday on business. His company have been considering the question of putting on a small vessel to carry freight from Coos Bay to the smaller ports on the coast, in connection with the Breakwater.

Claud Yates was arrested Monday evening and taken before Justice Severy on a charge of assault, preferred by Frank L. Condon. Tuesday morning, after hearing the testimony, the court rendered a decision against the defendant and fined him five dollars and costs. The fine was paid at once.—Florence West.

RAILROAD SUIT AGAIN POSTPOND

R. A. Graham's suit against the Coos Bay, Roseburg & Eastern Railway & Navigation company, which was supposed to come up for a hearing this week at Coquille, was continued for the term. Judge Harris came in from Eugene to try the case, Judge Coke being disqualified to sit in the case as he had acted as attorney for the company in the transactions over which the litigation is involved. The plaintiff and his attorney were not present when the case was called on the docket, but John F. Hall appeared with a telegram from E. B. Watson, from Portland, authorizing him to ask for a continuance of the matter, and the court acquiesced in his request.—Marshfield Sun.
