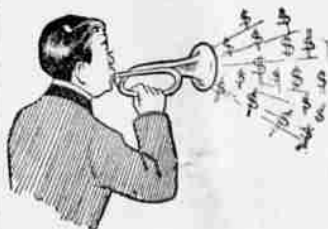

HOOD RIVER BERRY

CROP, 60,000 CRATES

Hood River, Or., May 24.—Small
shipments of strawberries are com-
mencing to be brought in and a few
crates have already gone out. The
first berries are bringing \$5 a crate
with many more orders than can be
supplied. The largest shipments
from this section are now being sent
out from Mosier, where the East
Hood River Fruit company, is ship-
ping about 12 crates a day. This
company has the largest strawberry
field in this section of Oregon, be-
ing 33 acres in extent and a little
later 60 to 80 pickers will be put at
work gathering the immense crop
which is fast ripening.

The berry crop at Hood River this
year is expected to reach 60,000
crates but will be shipped out from
a week to ten days later than last sea-
son. A curiosity in the way of
strawberries has been brought into
the city by Thomas Prime, a resident
of the Oak Grove district. He ex-
hibited a box of fine fruit grown on
plants that were set last November.
As berries are not expected to yield
until the second year after they are
planted, the fact that those grown
by Mr. Prime matured so quickly is
thought remarkable. The latter
claims that their quick growth is
due to a new system of cultivation
which he is using.

WILL BORE FOR OIL

IN LINN COUNTY

A new oil company has been or-
ganized for the purpose of prospect-
ing for oil near Lacombe. The new
company is composed largely of
Portland capitalists and business-
men. Among the local men is C. H.
Vehrs, of Lebanon. The new
company will be known as the Cas-
cade Petroleum Co.

Two of the promoters were in Le-
banon and in the Lacombe country
last week looking over the field, and
leased 2000 acres of land near Bea-
ver Creek, where their prospecting
will be begun within a week.

The men in this company are the
same as those now boring for oil at
Pratum. In the eastern part of Ma-
rion county, and are in this business
for ascertaining if there is oil in the
Cascade range country, where they
believe it exists. They do not ex-
pect to secure oil without boring
down several thousand feet.

This company is a distinct one
from the Lebanon Oil and Mining
Co., organized some time ago.—Al-
bany Herald.

HON. J. A. EAKIN NAMED
FOR JUDGE FIFTH DIST.

Hon. J. A. Eakin, of Astoria, Clat-
sop county, has been appointed as
the additional circuit judge of the
Fifth judicial district by Governor
Benson to serve until January, 1911.
Judge Eakin is a brother of Jus-
tice Eakin of the supreme court and
was admitted to the bar October 4,
1887. He was born in Chicago in
1860 and in 1886 came to Oregon
to practice law. After practicing
law in this state a few years he re-
turned to Boston, Mass., where he
entered the Boston law school, grad-
uated, and again came to Oregon.

The position to which Mr. Eakin
is appointed was created by the last
legislature, it being an additional
circuit judge for the district com-
posed of Clatsop, Clackamas, Colum-
bia and Washington counties. Hon.
C. E. Campbell is the other judge
of the Fifth district.
