COMING WEEK

Washington, D. C., May 29.—The dedication and opening of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition in Seattle will take place Tuesday and will be made the occasion for interesting ceremonies. President Taft in Washington will press a golden key that will flash the telegraphic signal for the opening of the big fair.

The case of the government against Delavan Smith and Charles R. Williams, owners of the Indianapolis News, in the Panama libel case, is to come up for a hearing in the federal court at Indianapolis.

Secretary of the Navy Myer will present the diplomas to the graduates of the United States naval academy at Annapolis Friday. The social and other festivities that always mark the closing week at the academy will continue through the entire week.

Commencement exercises at several other institutions will attract attention during the week. At the University of Missouri commencement Dr. Charles W. Elliot, ex-President of Harvard, will be given an honorary degree, and McGill University, Montreal, will confer a similar honor on Hon. James Wilson, secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture.

After a long and distinguished career in the army, Lieut.-Gen. Arthur MacArthur will be placed on the retired list Wednesday on account of age. As a result of Gen. MacArthur's retirement, Major General Leonard Wood, now in command of the Military Department of the East, will become the senior officer of the army.

An event of interest in naval circles will be the presentation of a magnificent silver service to the battleship Mississippi by the state of Mississippi. The presentation is to be made Tuesday at Horn Island, near the mouth of the Mississippi river.

Thursday evening, if the sky is clear, there will be an unusually fine opportunity to see a total eclipse of the moon. The phenomenon will be visible over the greater part of North America, and can be seen without the aid of glass or telescope.

Important conventions of the week will include those of the National Travelers' Protective Association at Asheville, the Fraternity of Operative Millers of America at Chicago, the National Railway Mail Clerks' Association at Atlanta, the United Brewers' Association at Atlantic City, and the National Association of Retail Grocers at Portland, Oregon.

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CAPITAL WELCOMES BRAVE JAP BARON

Chief of Staff of Japanese Navy
Has Brilliant Record.

Washington, D. C., May 29.—Washington has extended a hearty welcome to the famous Baron Sotokichi Uru, chief of staff of the Japanese navy, who is spending several weeks in this vicinity prior to his departure for Europe. Vice Admiral Uru is a graduate of the Annapolis naval academy and in recognition of this fact the alumni of the academy have arranged to give him a dinner tonight at the Metropolitan club. Monday there will be a reception in his honor given by Representative John W. Weeks of Massachusetts, who was a classmate of the admiral's at Annapolis. Later in the week he will attend the graduation exercises at the naval academy.

Vice Admiral Uru is regarded as one of the world's greatest naval authorities. After his course at the Annapolis academy he was detailed to the Naval College of Japan in 1881, and appointed a member of the committee for compiling a gunnery textbook. Having seen service afloat on several ships, he was appointed aid to the Minister of Marine, promoted lieutenant commander and detailed and detailed to the General Staff department. He was appointed captain of the Akagi in 1891, chief of the Yokosuka Naval Barracks and naval attaché at Paris in 1892. On his recall from France he was appointed superintendent of men-of-war and ordnance construction, and his promotion to rear admiral and appointment as chief of the First Bureau, Naval Staff department, followed in 1900.

During the Russo-Japanese war Vice Admiral Uru commanded the squadron which destroyed the Russian cruisers Varlag and Korietz in Chumulo harbor, and at the battle of the Sea of Japan he commanded the second division of the fleet under Admiral Togo. Since that time he has been in charge of the staff and naval construction of the Japanese navy at Sasebo and Tsushima. On his present trip to America and Europe the Vice Admiral is accompanied by the Baroness Uru, who was one of the first Japanese girls to be graduated from Vassar College.

INCOME TAX IS POSTPONED

Washington, May 27.—By a decisive vote of 50 to 33, the senate today decided to postpone until June 10 further consideration of the income tax in connection with the tariff.

Consideration of the sugar schedule was continued, but after two amendments were voted upon, the senate switched to a discussion of the possibility of getting a vote on the Bailey income tax amendment. Bailey argued faithfully for a vote, but did not succeed in prevailing on Aldrich to concede in advance of the tariff schedule.

The two amendments to the sugar schedule voted upon were those eliminating the duties on standard test and lowering the duty on refined sugar from 1.90 cents per pound, 0.8th were defeated, the former by 36 to 47 and the latter by 32 to 53. On the first vote 11 republicans voted with the democrats for the amendment, but on the second only seven republicans broke rank.
