OREGON CONQUERS EASILY

But O. A. C. Takes Points That Cause Some Surprise.

The University of Oregon defeated O. A. C. yesterday by 79 to 52, a little less than the Eugene sanguine supporters expected, yet with enough to allay all doubts of superiority. Huston was caught in ten seconds in the hundred yard dash, and Paul Reid took the 220 yard dash in the fast time of 22 1-5 seconds. Despite the cold day, Bergman of O. A. C. broke the Oregon Agricultural college record which Smithson held, by making the run and jump race in 25 3-5 seconds, just 1-5 of a second more than the coast record.

Oregon fell down badly in the uncertain discus, where McIntyre was expected to take first. The only event in which Oregon failed to get a point was the high jump. Hawkins did well in the high hurdles, running them consistently in 16 seconds, the college record.

The day was cold and rainy, and the places where the variety failed to make her showing may have been due to it, to some degree.

CRUDE MATERIAL IS BEST

Best Track Men Most Frequently Do Not Make Good In High School

That colleges and universities do not get many of their best athletes from the high schools to which they look forward to for new men, but develop them from raw material, is the opinion of a college man who is familiar with track work in California and the Northwest. The average high school athlete of reputation usually appears to wear himself out before he enters college, or by developing too young.

The best men at California and Stanford, says this same man, are rarely heard from in their preparatory days. Snedigar was a rough country boy, yet he beat all the fast "prep" men.

Here at Oregon the rule seems to follow with some exceptions. Hawkins, Davis, Reid, McDaniels, Lowell, Williams, Bristow and Downs had done practically nothing before they entered college, and some of them were beaten by men who are now in college, but could not approach their present status.

Huston and Moon appear to be exceptions, and Dan Kelly was another. But none of these men had the opportunity to enter many people in their scholastic days, and so were never overtrained when young.
