O. A. C. MEN PROFESSIONALS
Play Preps then Claim Northwest and State Championship on Break-Even Record.

The University correspondent of the Telegram says:

With the closing up of the intercollegiate baseball season in Oregon, the State Agricultural College is trying to talk its team into the championship. A member of the athletic council says: "Oregon and O. A. C. played four games, each team winning two. Now O. A. C. comes out with the argument that Oregon played Curtis Coleman, a professional, for four innings in one game, an consequently this game does not count. This is a misrepresentation, for Coleman's amateur standing was straight, and the Oregon faculty can produce affidavits to show it so. In charging professionalism, the O. A. C. contingent does not stop to consider that their own captain, Otto Moore, is a professional and makes no bones about it."

The Corvallis battery that played against Oregon is also the battery of the Lebanon town team, a professional organization. Last Sunday the Corvallis center-field, Keck, played with Albany, and other members of the team have played Sunday ball all season with the various semi-professional teams of the state.

Another singular fact in connection with the "Acies" is that Oregon is the only college team the Corvallis men have played, whereas Oregon has met every intercollegiate team in the Northwest except Washington. It is a strange thing that the Benton county college never plays or meets anybody but prep, and then thinks she can meet Oregon for the Northwest championship.

MANY KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS HERE SUNDAY, JUNE 13

Special Train Coming Up from Portland Saturday Night

Five sleeping cars will constitute the special train which will carry the Knights of Columbus from Portland to Eugene next Saturday night. At least 125 members of the Portland Council will make the trip to participate in the installation of a new council at the home of the Oregon University. There will be delegations from Coos Bay, Astoria, Baker City and Vancouver, Wash.

The committee in charge believes that this will be the largest excursion for a new council that has ever been given by the Knights of Columbus in Oregon. The special train of sleepers will leave Portland late Saturday night, arriving at Eugene early Sunday morning. The train will bring the members back to Portland at 7 o'clock Monday morning. All day Sunday will be devoted to the work at Eugene. The degree work starts promptly at 1:30 o'clock and the initiation will end with a splendid banquet. The Knights of Columbus made choir will accompany the excursion, rehearsal for the choir being called at the clubhouse for next Tuesday evening.

In Eugene, elaborate preparations are being made to entertain the visitors and the train will be met at the depot by a delegation of citizens and the candidates. The new council at Eugene will start with 50 members.—Oregonian.

SAYS FRATERNITIES SHOULD BE UNDER FACULTY CONTROL

Members of the college fraternities were criticized in a lecture delivered in a Chicago Baptist church by Professor John A. Reed, dean of the University of Michigan. Professor Reed said he believed fraternities were responsible for most of the poor scholarship and discipline among college students. He added that the members learned bad habits and a defiance of law that affected their college life and that almost all of the students conditioned at college were fraternity students, while the non-fraternity men stood high in their classes. Despite the evil he saw in fraternities, the professor did not advocate their abolition. He said they needed to be brought under college control.
