Fitzhugh Lee, of Route 3, delivered 20,123 pieces, 165 money orders and sold \$6.62 worth of stamps.

Chas. Tower, of Route 4, delivered 34,410 pieces, 13 money orders, and sold \$85.30 worth of stamps.
