ORDINANCE No. 881

An Ordinance fixing the time with in which city water may be used for irrigation purposes.

The City of Eugene does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to take water from the water works owned by the city for the purpose of irrigation, except from six o'clock p. m. to eight o'clock p. m. of any day.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$10.00 and in default of the payment of said fine, may be imprisoned in the city jail one day for each \$2.00 thereof.

Sec. 3. Inasmuch as there is at present an insufficient supply of water to protect the city from fire, which condition is the result of the excessive use of water for irrigation, it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of Eugene that this ordinance be in effect upon its passage and approval by the mayor, and therefore this ordinance shall be in effect upon its passage and approval by the mayor.
