NICKELL CASE UP

TO PRESIDENT

Utterance of Taft Relating to Meldrum Quoted Now as Unfavorable.

Washington, June 14.—Senators Bourne and Chamberlain have interviewed Attorney-General Wickersham concerning the petition for the pardon of Charles Nickell, the Jacksonville, (Or.) newspaper editor who was convicted of land frauds and who was recently denied a writ of certiorari by the Supreme Court. Petitions numerously signed have been forwarded.

Though the senators and others will exert influence to induce the utterance of Taft when Meldrum's application came up would seem to indicate that it is not likely Nickell's pardon will be granted. The President said as to Meldrum: "No government official convicted of acts of official criminality should be pardoned."

As Nickell was a United States Commissioner it is therefore probable he will have to serve his sentence.
