WE MUST BUILD RAILROADS.

Eugene needs railroads to make it the commercial and industrial center that we all hope some day it will become. Electric roads especially will bring about the cutting up of large ranches and make the small, intensively cultivated farms profitable by bringing the producer and the market closer together. Such conditions will provide homes for the thousands of immigrants pouring into the Willamette Valley annually and with increasing population, affording a home market for goods, will come manufacturing industries and new payrolls.

Eugene, as the largest and most ambitious town in the Upper Willamette Valley, must take the lead in the movement for new railroads, because it can grow but slowly in the future without the fullest development of the surrounding country. No city can have a permanent growth beyond that justified by the population and producing capacity of the territory within its trade area. Railroads built through agricultural and timber districts mean continued growth and expanding business; the lack of such transportation facilities must result in conditions the reverse of these.

We must get together on this railroad question, accept the most feasible proposition obtainable and go to work to produce results. This is the one great work left for the people of Eugene to do—all the other desirable things in the way of the city's advancement will follow as a natural sequence.

Here is the way the Portland Daily Journal views the street improvement work done in Eugene during the past two years: "Several prominent business men of The Dalles visited Eugene recently to get pointers about city improvements, and particularly about street paving, and on their return were unanimously and enthusiastically in favor of paved streets and cement sidewalks, such as Eugene has. They observed not only how greatly these improvements had bettered the appearance of the city, but how it had enhanced the value of abutting property and helped cause the city to grow. For years The Journal has been telling the cities of Oregon that 'good paving pays,' and most of them are finding it out. Eugene set the example, which Pendleton, Salem, Roseburg, Albany and other cities are following."

PRUNE CROP LIGHT
IN DOUGLAS COUNTY

F. A. McCall went to Myrtle Creek today to get estimates on the prune crop in that locality. He is now working for Tilton & Company, of Salem. Mr. McCall says that in the localities tributary to Roseburg the prune crop this year will not be over 40 per cent as large as it was last year. Some growers will have no crops at all, while in the Colusa Valley district the output will exceed that of 1908. Those who will have good-sized crops will not make contracts for delivery owing to the fact that there is no buying competition in the field at the present time—Roseburg Review.

Roseburg, Or., June 14.—The body of Stephen Haysanny, who disappeared from his brother's home in Roseburg three weeks ago today, was found floating in the Umpqua river a quarter of a mile south of this city Sunday afternoon. He was clad in a bathing suit, and the theory is that he took a crank, as the water was cold and he was overheated from the day's work. Haysanny was aged 21 and was single. He came from Germany two months ago.

BITULITHIC CO.
WINS AGAINST
ASPHALT TRUST

The Atlantic City (New Jersey). Union says: About a year ago newspapers throughout the country printed a decision rendered by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals in favor of Warren Brothers Company jointly against the Barber Asphalt Paving Company and the City of Oswego, Michigan, this suit having been brought by Warren Brothers Company as patentees and owners of the patents covering the Bitulithic pavement, in order to test the validity of their patents.

The Barber Asphalt Paving Company had induced the city officials of Oswego to permit them to lay an imitation of the Bitulithic pavement, the Asphalt Trust offering to protect the city with any size indemnity bond, and to lay their paving at about one-half the actual cost of Bitulithic. The owners of the Bitulithic patent entered a legal protest against the city of Oswego and the Asphalt Trust, in order to prevent infringement of their patents.

Telegraphic reports received in the city this morning state that the United States Supreme Court has again denied the petition for a writ of certiorari, applied for jointly by the attorneys for the Asphalt Trust and the city of Oswego, thereby confirming the opinion rendered by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals and finally ending this litigation, which has been pending in the courts for more than four years, during which time most of the testimony was being taken. All of the leading chemists and best expert witnesses upon street paving conditions in the United States as well as dozens of city engineers from all parts of the United States, were examined as witnesses. The printed testimony, records and briefs in the case amounted to over two thousand pages.

The decision of the United States Court just rendered is one of great importance to all municipalities throughout the country, as it is final, and will forever end the attempt to lay imitation Bitulithic pavement. The decision of the Court of Last Appeal finally adjudicates both the fact of the infringement and the validity of the patents.
