NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to ordinance No. 851, duly passed by the common council the 27th day of April, 1909, and approved by the mayor on the 27th day of April, 1909, a special city election will be held on the 28th day of June, 1909, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the city of Eugene the following proposed amendments to the charter of Eugene and proposed bills, to-wit:

1. To amend the charter of the City of Eugene by adding Section 135, authorizing the common council to acquire and condemn real estate, water rights and rights of way for a water works system, electrical lighting plant and other municipal purposes.

2. Granting to the council of the City of Eugene the power and authority to create and incur an indebtedness of not to exceed \$5,000 for the purpose of securing a proper site and erecting thereon an adequate city hall.

3. To amend subdivision 18 of Section 48, of the charter of the City of Eugene so as to grant to the common council the power and authority to license, regulate and prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors in the city of Eugene; to declare all place where intoxicating liquors are kept for sale to be common nuisances and to provide for search and seizure.

4. To amend Section 25 of the city charter to confer upon the council the power to prescribe the qualifications of voters at municipal elections.

5. To amend Section 24 of the charter of Eugene so as to provide for an annual salary of \$420 for the mayor and \$260 for each councilman.

6. To authorize the common council to create a bond commission and to expend \$5,000 per annum for the maintenance of the bond.

7. An act to amend Sections 86, 87 and 88 of the city charter, providing the manner of condemning land for streets and sewers.

8. To amend section 87 of the city charter relating to the limit of indebtedness.

The following are hereby designated as polling places and judges and clerks thereof:

First ward—House house, East Eleventh street; Judges—S. R. Williams, P. D. Newell, W. B. Dillard; Newell and Dillard designated as clerks.

Second ward—Water office, city hall building; Judges—P. S. Tingley, J. J. Walton, A. A. Simmons; Walton and Simmons designated as clerks.

Third ward—No. 41 West Seventh street; Judges—A. J. Pickard, William G. Martin, Carl T. Travis; Martin and Travis designated as clerks.

Fourth ward—Back room, Gordon block on Olive street; Judges—S. M. Yoran, A. N. Striker, J. M. Howe; Striker and Howe designated as clerks.
