## DIDN'T SEE MUCH OF SUN'S ECLIPSE

Eugenet People Rather Disappointed Yesterday Afternoon.

It was practically impossible to convince the "man on the street" there was an eclipse in progress late yesterday afternoon. To no appreciable degree did the earth get darker, at any rate not in part of Eugene residents are familiar with. Those who took a piece of smoked glass in their hands and gazed through it were able to see a dark oval-shaped black spot slowly pass over the upper part of the sun.

At no stage did it dim the sun's brightness noticeably and apparently not more than one-fifth of the sun's surface was traversed by the moon's shadow.

An eclipse of the sun is caused by the moon obstructing a full view of the sun from the earth. Olden legends say when an eclipse was due, the devil would race in his fiery chariot across the sky and bite a piece off the fiery orb. This piece he would take with him to replenish the fires he kept specially for those who went to make their abode with him.

Going still further back in the line of history, the ancient Sun worshippers believed it was in grief at their earthly transgressions that the sun hid his face from the multitude. This is still a common belief among the natives of Tierra del Fuego, South America, and when a total eclipse is due, traders and others know the native mind becomes malleable as may be desired. It is in those regions the policies of the missionaries to educate the natives along the correct line, unless unfortunately their lives be ended in the meantime.

Certain islands in the South Seas are also inhabited, according to the report of certain travelers, by a race of people fearing an eclipse or taking it as a sign of Divine wrath.

## NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to ordinance No. 851, duly passed by the common council the 27th day of April, 1909, and approved by the mayor on the 27th day of April, 1909, a special city election will be held on the 28th day of June, 1909, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the city of Eugene the following proposed amendments to the charter of Eugene and proposed bills, to-wit:

1. To amend the charter of the City of Eugene by adding Section 135 authorizing the common council to acquire and condemn real estate, water rights and rights of way for a water works system, electrical lighting plant and other municipal purposes.

2. Granting to the council of the City of Eugene the power and authority to create and incur an indebtedness of not to exceed \$85,000 for the purpose of securing a proper site and erecting thereon an adequate city hall.

3. To amend subdivision 18 of Section 48, of the charter of the City of Eugene so as to grant to the common council the power and authority to license, regulate and prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors in the city of Eugene; to declare all places where intoxicating liquors are kept for sale to be common nuisances and to provide for search and seizure.

4. To amend Section 25 of the city charter to confer upon the council the power to prescribe the qualifications of voters at municipal elections.

5. To amend Section 34 of the charter of Eugene so as to provide for an annual salary of \$420 for the mayor and \$360 for each councilman.

6. To authorize the common council to create a band commission and to expend \$3,000 per annum for the maintenance of the band.

7. An act to amend Sections 86, 87 and 97 of the city charter, providing the manner of condemning land for streets and sewers.

8. To amend section 27 of the city charter relating to the limit of indebtedness.

The following are hereby designated polling places and judges and clerks thereof:

First ward—Hose house, East Eleventh street; Judges—S. R. Williams, P. D. Newell, W. B. Dillard; Newell and Dillard designated as clerks.

Second ward—Water office, city hall building. Judges—F. S. Tingley, J. J. Walton, A. A. Simmons; Walton and Simmons designated as clerks.

Third ward—No. 41 West Seventh street. Judges—A. J. Pickard, William G. Martin, Carl T. Travis; Martin and Travis designated as clerks.

Fourth ward—Back room, Gordon block on Olive street. Judges—S. M. Moran, A. N. Striker, J. M. Howe; Striker and Howe designated as clerks.
