DR. MCINTURFF'S REVIVAL AT SALEM

Draws Large Crowds and Much Interest is Manifested Therein.

Dr. D. N. McInturff, former pastor of the M. E. church in Eugene, is conducting a successful revival in the capital city. The Morning Statesman of that city says: "The great union revival being conducted in the Baptist church by Dr. D. N. McInturff and his splendid band of workers is growing in interest. At each service great excitement and enthusiasm has reigned through the city since Sunday morning, when the greatest climax yet was reached. For nearly an hour Dr. McInturff held the vast audience spellbound. He was not only eloquent, but a strange power from God, rested upon him, as he in a marvelous and beautiful manner opened up the plan of salvation. All were in tears and at the close he made a most earnest appeal for all to give their best to God, and requested those who would do so to come and give him their hand. Hundreds came forward and with an earnest purpose written on every face, and many weeping, gave the evangelist their hand. After the evangelist's hand, after the church was dismissed, in different parts of the building were seen the penitent ones, kneeling, seeking God in the forgiveness of their sins.

In the evening the interest was intense and the people crowded the great auditorium. Though the doctor had preached twice already during the day, he started forth and began the sermon of the evening with great vigor and earnestness.

The doctor is full of wit and apt illustrations, and sweeping from one climax to another, held his audience spellbound every minute, now in tears and again convulsed with laughter. The Spokesman-Review but speaks the truth when it says of him: "He has the fervor and religious enthusiasm of a John Wesley, and the eloquence and power of a Patrick Henry." Dr. McInturff is no specialist for any class, but is a friend to every man, equally at home in the palace of the rich or the poorest hovel. At the close of one of the street meetings, a young man with a splendid face said, "I would like to come to the meeting at the church but have no clothes except these working clothes." Dr. McInturff replied, "If you are ashamed of your clothes I will preach in your overalls and you may have my clothes." And he meant it. The young man came in his overalls, sought, and found Christ, that very night.

The evangelist's manner of reading the Scriptures is most attractive. When reading about Christ talking to the woman at the well, "who had five husbands," he said, "you would

have thought she lived in Oregon." (Great laughter). Most evangelists rest on Monday night but Dr. McInturff presses right on. Monday night great interest was manifested, and numbers passed into the anteroom to seek Christ. Among whom were some of the business men of the city.

Dr. McInturff preaches a manly gospel, and thereby appeals to men, the thinker, the scholar.

Dr. McInturff comes from North Yakima, Wash., where he has just closed a meeting in which 600 conversions were reported, among whom are to be found some of the business men, doctors and city officials.

Salem is most fortunate in having Dr. McInturff here and the Baptist people are to be congratulated that they have him in their church.

It can not be said of Dr. McInturff that he is out for the money, for he has given up very flattering business propositions of his own, and refused a position, in a bank paying \$500 per month in order to evangelize.

He will not put a price on his ministry, but goes everywhere without money and without price, receiving whatever the people give in free-will offerings. Up to date in these meetings one hundred and sixty have knelt at the altar and sought God's peace. One hundred and forty of these professed salvation.

If the people of Salem but knew and could see their opportunity in this meeting, and if the churches and pastors of all denominations would unite as one man the whole city would be reached and thousands would be saved.

SAMUEL GOMPERS GOES TO EUROPE

New York, June 19.—Among the passengers sailing on the Baltic today is President Samuel Gompers of the American Federation of Labor, who will remain abroad until sometime in September.

Mr. Gompers will make a thorough study of economic and sociological conditions existing in the various European countries. He will attend several labor congresses and make a general investigation of industrial conditions in Great Britain and the Continent. He has been informed that the Court of Appeals of the District of Columbia will not render a decision in the contempt case in which he is one of the defendants, until the October term.

"Our annual convention is to be held in November," said Mr. Gompers, "so I will get back in time either to attend it or go to jail. I would prefer," he added, "to attend the convention."

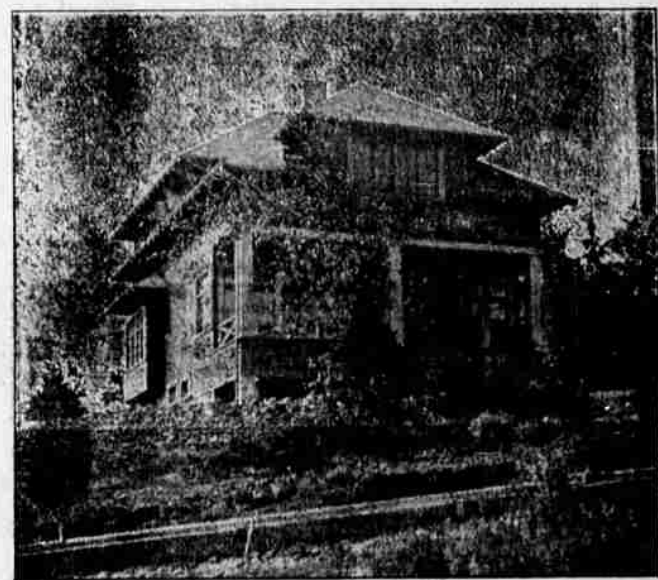

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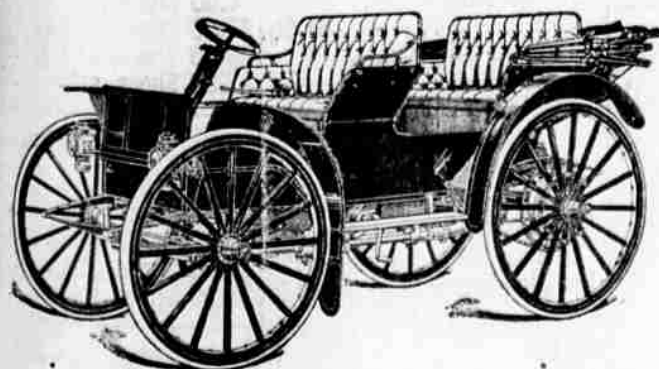
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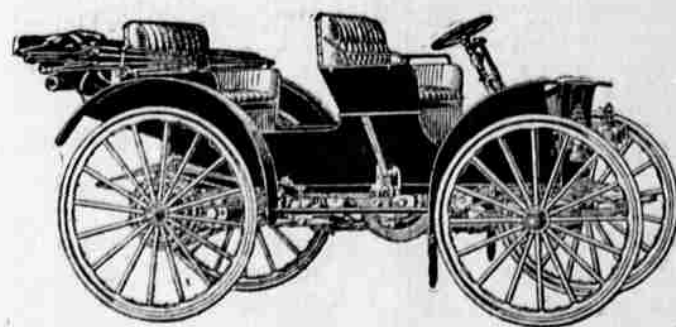
