A new grand jury was chosen as follows: H. C. Wheeler, foreman; J. L. Beaver, S. S. Snell, L. Lockard, B. F. Cleek, Frank Harlow, Geo. A. Drury. Sam Flint was appointed grand jury bailiff and F. L. Armistage will still act as court bailiff.

Woman Arrested.
Mrs. Rena C. Parsons, wife of Oscar Parsons of Springfield, was arrested Saturday evening, charged with violating the local option law. She was arraigned in court this morning. It's understood that her husband has left the county.

More Arraignments.

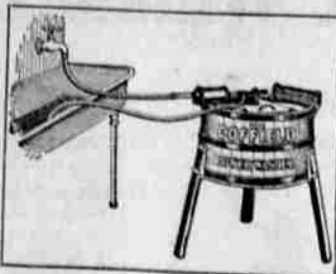
