## SIUSLAW PORT HAS BEEN DULY ORGANIZED

First Meeting Held in Florence on Tuesday of Last Week.

The first meeting of the commissioners of the Port of Siuslaw was held Tuesday afternoon at 1 o'clock in the Odd Fellows' hall in Florence, says the Florence West. The commissioners having taken oath of office the meeting was called to order by I. B. Cushman and temporary organization was effected by electing Mr. Cushman chairman and T. A. Yost secretary. They then selected permanent officers as follows: I. B. Cushman, president; P. E. Jackson, vice-president; E. P. Waite, secretary; T. A. Yost treasurer. They then proceeded to draw for terms of office. Messrs Cushman, Camp and Waite drew the long or four years' term, and Messrs Jackson and Yost the short term. ## SOME RADICAL CHANGES IN THE TRAIN SCHEDULE

New Time Card Goes Into Effect Tomorrow — Cottage Grove Local at 4.30 a.m.

The Southern Pacific company's new through train has been put on and the first north bound train will pass through Eugene tomorrow evening at 5:21 o'clock. With the new service comes a new time card which makes several radical changes in the service through Eugene. Going north No. 16 will pass through the same as it did before, 2:43 a.m. The Cottage Grove local will pass through at 4:30 a.m. instead of 6 a.m. as heretofore. The Roseburg local, which has been extended to Ashland, will leave at 12:22 p. m. instead of 11:55 a. m.

as before, and No. 14 will pass at 5:30 p. m. instead of 6:42 as heretofore. The new train which is designated as No. 12, will leave at 5:21 p. m.
