STREET CAR STRIKES WAGON, DRIVER DRAGGED

Frank Goodman Suffers Bruises in Runaway This Morning—Didn't See Car.

Frank Goodman, formerly in the cigar business in this city, was slightly injured this morning by being dragged a short distance on the pavement by his team which he was driving to the running gears of a wagon, the team taking fright at a street car striking the vehicle.

Goodman was driving west on Sixth street about 9:15 o'clock and started across Willamette street just as the depot-bound car came along. Motorman Flouten saw the team and wagon and noticed that the driver was looking in the opposite direction. He rang the bell vigorously and reversed the current but he was unable to stop the car before it struck the wagon. This frightened the horses and they began to run. Goodman was thrown to the pavement and was dragged fifty or sixty feet. The team ran on out West Sixth street.

Goodman received a number of minor bruises and scratches. He says no one was to blame for the accident but himself.

OREGON EXHIBIT FEATURE OF FAIR

Oregon's superb exhibit at the A-Y-P Exposition is attracting visitors in such numbers as to tax the capacity of the big Oregon building at all hours. This is the report of W. H. Wehrung, president of the Oregon commission, who arrived from Seattle yesterday to spend a few days in Portland perfecting arrangements for Portland and Oregon days at the exposition.

"The Oregon building is thronged with visitors at all times," said Mr. Wehrung. "The exhibits awaken a wonderful enthusiasm among visitors from all parts of the country, and particularly from the east. Oregon's resources are fittingly revealed in the various displays in the building, and this big exhibit is easily one of the features of the exposition."

"Visitors are entertained every day by a program which includes alternating moving pictures and orchestra concerts. Beginning at 1:15 each afternoon, moving pictures and colored slides are shown, the subjects dealing with Oregon. The pictures continue 20 minutes and then follows a concert of 20 minutes duration. This alternating program continues until night."

"I expect a tremendous turnout of Oregon people for Oregon day, July 3," said Mr. Wehrung. "Oregon is already sending visitors in large numbers. Portland day will be another big event at the fair. The program for the two days will be out soon."

ELK PRESERVE IN SILETZ IS PLANNED

Washington, June 24.—Representative Hawley today introduced a bill at the request of the order of Elks, setting aside sections 12 and 13, T. 10, S. R. 10 W., to be known as the Siletz Elk Preserve. The bill authorizes the appointment of a superintendent of the preserve at a salary of \$900.

At the meeting of the grand lodge of Elks, which convened in Dallas, Texas, last year, a resolution was adopted asking the government to set aside a suitable preserve for the better protection of elk.

THE EUGENE WAY.

To the Editor—

But little interest appears to be taken in the city election to be held June 28. Perhaps the reason for this is that the people are to vote upon measures and not for men. One of the proposed amendments is to give each member of the city council a small salary. This amendment will not relate back, but applies to the future only. In a majority of the states, at least, a laborer is considered worthy of compensation, and each member of the town or city council receives some remuneration. In Iowa, mayors and councilmen may receive salaries which range from \$50 per annum to \$3,500 per annum, depending of course upon the size of the town or city and the form of government. In Des Moines the mayor receives an annual salary of \$3,500 and each councilman \$3,000. In a number of cities in our own state the mayors and councilmen receive salaries. Why should Eugene be behind other cities in giving her officers "a square deal"? Our mayor and councilmen receive absolutely nothing for their services as the charter now is. The purpose of one of the amendments is to provide that the mayor may have an annual salary of \$420, and that each councilman have an annual salary of \$360. This is a rapidly growing city and it will continue to grow for many years to come. As a consequence of this growth of the city very much time is required as the mayor and council in looking after the interests of the city, and it will require more and more of their time as the years go by. We cannot reasonably expect our city officers to continue to devote their time to the interests of the people for absolutely nothing as in the past, and it will not be the Eugene Way to reject this amendment; but rather it will be the Eugene Way to see that this amendment carries in order that our city officers in the future may have a little something for their responsible services to the city.
