WORKING ON P. E. & E. POWER SITE UP RIVER

Company Spending \$1000 a Month Clearing Site—More Cars for Local System

"We are now spending \$1000 a month at the site of our proposed electric power plant at Martin's rapids, on the McKenzie," said A. Welch, vice-president and general manager of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway Co., to a reporter this morning. "We are clearing the site in preparation to build. The plant will call for an expenditure of \$300,000, and it will furnish electricity for our proposed electric railroads as far north as Albany."

Mr. Welch is not certain whether or not immediate work will begin on the plant, but if it is decided to go right ahead with the project it will be completed some time this fall. Martin's rapids are 32 miles from Eugene and the site owned by the company is said to be the best on the river for power purposes.

Bridge This Summer.
In regard to completing the big bridge across the Willamette at Springfield, Mr. Welch said he thought the work would be done this summer, although there is no certainty about the matter. He and President Storey are conferring in regard to the matter, also in regard to the extension of the local street railway line to the fair grounds.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the terms of Ordinance No. 886, passed by the Common Council of the City of Eugene June 17th, 1909, bids will be received by the street committee of the Common Council until five o'clock p. m. July 8th, 1909, at the office of the City Recorder of said city, for the improvement of the alley between Willamette and Oak streets from 7th street to Park street in the City of Eugene, by paving said alley over its entire width between said points with bitulithic, asphalt or other hard surface pavement, in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor now on file in the office of the City Recorder.

Bidders are required to state the price in detail in accordance with the specifications and on the form prepared by the City Engineer. Separate contracts will be awarded to the lowest bidder for the paving and drainage of said alley. Said improvement shall be commenced within thirty days of letting of said contracts and completed within three months thereafter. The work to be done under the supervision of the Street Committee and to be approved by them. An approved bond will be required of each contractor for the faithful performance of the contract. A certified check in a sum equal to five per cent of the amount payable to J. D. Matlock, Mayor, is required to accompany each bid. The Street Committee reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

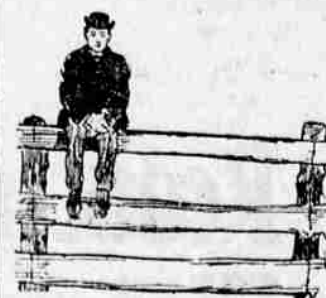
