JUNE BUILDING PERMITS ARE HIGHEST YET

Record Month for Building in Eugene—\$100,000 Hotel Swells the Total

Building Inspector McFarland reports the largest month in permits during June in the history of his office. The month previous was the record month up to that time, but the new \$100,000 hotel helped to swell the total for June, establishing a new record. The permits aggregated \$145,725. During the month permits for 29 residences were issued, as against 28 for May. This does not indicate that there is much of a cessation in building, although it is admitted that there are not so many residences going up as there were in the early spring and last fall.
