ENCAMPMENT AT CLACKAMAS STATION NEAR PORTLAND BEGINS

Third Infantry Goes Into Camp Today—Regulars Also Reach There

Portland, July 12.—After a march of 20 miles, much of the way in a rain storm, Company G, First United States Infantry, and a machine gun detachment arrived at Clackamas station near Vancouver Barracks, yesterday forenoon, and established camp to participate in the annual field exercises of the Oregon National Guard. The regular troops left their barracks Saturday afternoon and bivouacked in the field over night. Notwithstanding their wet march the men were in excellent condition upon their arrival.

The Third Oregon Infantry will arrive at the camp grounds today. The Eastern Oregon companies, from Baker City, Pendleton and The Dalles, moved last night and arrived in Portland at an early hour this morning. The Willamette Valley companies, from Woodburn and Salem, departed from their home stations this morning by train, while the six Portland companies, headquarters and the ambulance company, left the Portland armory at 8 o'clock this morning, marching the 12 miles to camp. The Oregon City company will likewise march. Company cooks will be sent ahead so that mess will be in readiness for the troops as they arrive.

All equipment and baggage were shipped yesterday and conveyed to the camp grounds. The finishing touches were put on the camping grounds during the day, so that everything is now in readiness for the arrival.

GITTINGS' SLAYER CAUGHT IN IDAHO

Melville G. Bradley is Under Arrest at Idaho Falls—Committed Murder in 1907

Portland, July 10.—Word was received here today that Melville G. Bradley, wanted here to answer to the charge of murder in connection with the death of Patrolman John W. Gittings in this city December 18, 1907, is under arrest at Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Bradley and his brother-in-law engaged in a quarrel over the alleged beating of Mrs. Bradley by her husband. Patrolman Gittings interfered and Bradley began shooting. Gittings responded and both men emptied their revolvers, the policeman receiving fatal wounds. Bradley disappeared and had not been heard of since.
