RHODES SCHOLARSHIP EXAMS IN OCTOBER

Each Candidate Must Pay a Fee of \$5 to Defray Expenses

The next qualifying examination for Rhodes scholarships for Oregon will be held Tuesday and Wednesday, October 19 and 20, 1909. The place for holding the examinations has not yet been definitely determined, but heretofore they have been held at the University of Oregon. The University will have several candidates for the examinations and it is probable that there will be a number from other parts of the state. Owing to the fact that no other means are provided for meeting the expenses of the examination a fee of \$15 will be charged each applicant.

The rules governing the examinations provide that all applicants must have reached, before going into residence at Oxford, at least the end of their sophomore or second year work at some recognized degree-granting university or college. The scholarships are of the value of \$300 a year, and are tenable for three years. Each candidate must be unmarried, must be a citizen of the United States, and be not more than 19 nor more than 25 years of age on October 1 of the year for which he is elected. One student only will be chosen from this state.

Oregon now has two students at Oxford, Edward J. Winans, from Willamette University, and Walter W. Johnson, from the University of Oregon. Johnson is taking mining engineering and Winans a literary course.
