BUCK SEASON OPENS AUG. 1

Pheasants Not Open Until October 15

The season for buck deer opens August 1 and closes November 1. Under a new law female deer must not be killed at any time. Violation of this law is punishable by a fine as high as \$500. Traffic in deer skins is prohibited unless they are properly tagged; tags can be secured upon application to any justice of the peace or county clerk. Hunting deer at night or chasing them with dogs is always unlawful. Deer under one year old must not be killed.

For native pheasants, quail and grouse the season opens October 15 and closes November 15. It is unlawful to trap or snare them. The bag limit for either of these three species of game birds is five in one day or ten in one week.

The duck season opens October 15 and closes February 15. The bag limit is 25 in one week.

Elk are protected until August 1, 1910. Hunters' and anglers' licenses good anywhere in Oregon.
